A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to training for certain individuals who provide care for
3	or services to children in the conservatorship of the Department of
4	Family and Protective Services.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 264.015, Family Code, is amended by
7	adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
8	(d) The department shall, in consultation with foster care
9	alumni, Preparation for Adult Living staff, institutions of higher
10	learning, and current foster youth, foster parents and adoptive
11	parents, adopt or develop a training program for any foster
12	parents, adoptive parents, or kinship caregivers regarding the most
13	effective methods of communicating with children who are or have
14	been in the conservatorship of the department about issues
15	regarding health and well-being, including:
16	(1) self-image;
17	(2) healthy relationships;
18	(3) goal setting;
19	(4) planning and decision making; and
20	(5) protection from sexually transmitted infections,
21	unintended pregnancy, and exploitation.
22	SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 264, Family Code, is
23	amended by adding Section 264.0151 to read as follows:
24	Sec. 264.0151. TRAINING MATERIALS FOR GUARDIANS AD LITEM,

- 1 ATTORNEYS AD LITEM, COURT APPOINTED SPECIAL ADVOCATES AND JUDGES.
- 2 The Supreme Court of Texas Permanent Judicial Commission for
- 3 Children, Youth and Families shall, in consultation with
- 4 stakeholders including, but not limited to, current guardians ad
- 5 litem, attorneys ad litem, and court appointed special advocates,
- 6 develop training materials for guardians ad litem, attorneys ad
- 7 litem, and judges who represent or preside over cases involving
- 8 children and youth in the conservatorship of the department
- 9 concerning the health and well-being of those children and youth,
- 10 including:
- 11 (1) policies regarding consent for health care
- 12 services, including reproductive health care, family planning, and
- 13 <u>contraceptive care;</u>
- 14 (2) general health and wellness;
- 15 (3) healthy relationships; and
- 16 (4) advocating for or representing pregnant and
- 17 parenting children and youth.
- SECTION 3. Subchapter B, Chapter 40, Human Resources Code,
- 19 is amended by adding Section 40.036 to read as follows:
- Sec. 40.036. CASEWORKER TRAINING ON HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS.
- 21 The department, in collaboration with an institute for higher
- 22 <u>learning</u>, shall create or adopt a required training program for
- 23 <u>child protective services caseworkers to provide instruction to the</u>
- 24 <u>caseworkers</u> on <u>developmentally-appropriate</u>, trauma-informed
- 25 methods of communicating with children in the managing
- 26 conservatorship of the department regarding reproductive health
- 27 and healthy relationships. The training must be informed by

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- 1 evidence-based or model curriculum and include content regarding:
- 2 (1) minor consent to sexual activity, including the
- 3 <u>legal age for consent under state law;</u>
- 4 (2) minor consent to health care services including
- 5 family planning or contraceptive services;
- 6 (3) preserving confidentiality; and
- 7 (4) providing services to a child who becomes pregnant
- 8 or who is a minor parent.
- 9 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
