- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Chapter 54, Government Code, is amended by
- 5 adding Subchapter RR to read as follows:

6 SUBCHAPTER RR. MAVERICK COUNTY MAGISTRATES

- 7 Sec. 54.2701. APPOINTMENT. (a) The Commissioners Court of
- 8 Maverick County may select magistrates to serve the justice courts
- 9 of the county.
- 10 (b) The commissioners court shall establish the salary,
- 11 benefits, and other compensation of each magistrate position and
- 12 shall determine whether the position is full-time or part-time.
- (c) A magistrate appointed under this subchapter serves at
- 14 the pleasure of the commissioners court.
- Sec. 54.2702. JURISDICTION. A magistrate appointed under
- 16 this subchapter has concurrent jurisdiction with the justices of
- 17 the justice of the peace courts of Maverick County.
- Sec. 54.2703. POWERS AND DUTIES. (a) The Commissioners
- 19 Court of Maverick County shall establish the powers and duties of a
- 20 magistrate appointed under this subchapter.
- 21 (b) An order of referral may limit the use or power of a
- 22 magistrate.
- 23 <u>(c) Unless limited by published local rule, by written</u>
- 24 order, or by an order of referral, a magistrate may perform all acts

- 1 and take all measures necessary and proper to perform the tasks
- 2 assigned in a referral.
- 3 (d) A magistrate may administer oaths.
- 4 Sec. 54.2704. JUDICIAL IMMUNITY. A magistrate has the same
- 5 judicial immunity as a district judge.
- 6 Sec. 54.2705. TRAINING. A magistrate appointed under this
- 7 <u>subchapter must successfully complete all training a justice of the</u>
- 8 peace is required to complete under state law.
- 9 Sec. 54.2706. FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH SUMMONS OR ORDER. If
- 10 an attorney, party, witness, or any other person fails to comply
- 11 with a summons or order, the magistrate may certify that failure in
- 12 writing to the referring court for appropriate action.
- Sec. 54.2707. WITNESSES. (a) A witness appearing before a
- 14 magistrate is subject to the penalties of perjury as provided by
- 15 Chapter 37, Penal Code.
- 16 (b) A witness referred to the court under Section 54.2706 is
- 17 subject to the same penalties and orders that may be imposed on a
- 18 witness appearing in a hearing before the court.
- 19 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 24 legislative session.
