R E S O L U T I O N

1           WHEREAS, The thousands of deaths caused by COVID-19 in Texas  
2 have created a tremendous void in families, communities, and  
3 workplaces throughout the state; among those who lost their lives  
4 in the pandemic was Dorothy Sue Caylor, a dedicated and  
5 well-respected employee of the Texas Department of Criminal  
6 Justice, who passed away on December 17, 2020, at the age of 62; and

7           WHEREAS, Dorothy Caylor was born in Dallas on June 12, 1958;  
8 she worked for West Georgia National Bank for 19 years, before  
9 returning to Texas and beginning her 15-year career with the Texas  
10 Department of Criminal Justice; she married William Caylor on  
11 December 23, 2006, and her treasured family included her daughter,  
12 Jamie, her two stepdaughters, Tonya and Crystal, and her four  
13 grandchildren; and

14           WHEREAS, Since 2005, Ms. Caylor had worked as a human  
15 resources specialist at the Roach Unit in Childress; she enjoyed a  
16 warm rapport with her colleagues, and she was known for her love of  
17 people, particularly children, and her affinity for baking; and

18           WHEREAS, Dorothy Caylor faithfully and ably performed her  
19 duties throughout her tenure with the Texas Department of Criminal  
20 Justice, and she will long be remembered with great admiration by  
21 all who were privileged to know her; now, therefore, be it

22           RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 87th Texas  
23 Legislature, 1st Called Session, hereby pay tribute to the life of  
24 Dorothy Sue Caylor and extend deepest sympathy to her family,

1 friends, and colleagues; and, be it further
