R E S O L U T I O N

4 in the pandemic was Rebecca Aauto Crowe, a dedicated and
5 well-respected employee of the Texas Department of Criminal
6 Justice, who passed away on January 1, 2021, at the age of 73; and

8 and her unfailing generosity; she was devoted to her family, which
9 included her sons, Michael Crowe and the late Chris Crowe, her
10 daughter-in-law, Melissa, her siblings, Olga, Julie, and Benny, and

12 interests, which included gardening, creating stained glass art
13 pieces, welding, and doing other projects around the home; over the
14 past year, she had worked at the Victoria District Parole Office,
15 where she endeared herself to her colleagues and made a lasting
16 impression on everyone; and

17 WHEREAS, Rebecca Crowe faithfully and ably performed her
18 duties throughout her tenure with the Texas Department of Criminal
19 Justice, and she will long be remembered with great admiration by
20 all who were privileged to know her; now, therefore, be it
