WHEREAS, Along with her involvement in Phi Theta Kappa, Ms. Burse has contributed to her campus community by serving as the student liaison on Grayson College's board of trustees, and in May 2021, she had the distinction of delivering the commencement address for the school's graduating classes; throughout her time at Grayson, she has benefited from the support and encouragement of her fellow students, and she has enjoyed sharing her unique perspective as a student over the age of 40, a single mother, and an individual who has dealt with the challenges of depression and anxiety; looking ahead to the future, she is planning to continue her studies at a four-year university; and

WHEREAS, Lavada Burse's hard work and perseverance have made her an inspiration to all who know her, and she may indeed take great pride in earning this prestigious recognition of her achievements; now, therefore, be it
