2	relating to the creation of the Climate Change Impact Assessment
3	Council.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. (a) In this section, "council" means the Climate
6	Change Impact Assessment Council established by this Act.
7	(b) The council is established to study the impact of
8	climate change on the health, safety, and welfare of the residents
9	of this state.

- 10 (c) The council is composed of the following members:
- 11 (1) two members of the senate appointed by the
- 12 lieutenant governor;
- 13 (2) two members of the house of representatives
- 14 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives; and
- 15 (3) seven members of the public appointed jointly by
- 16 the lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house of
- 17 representatives, including:
- 18 (A) one member with expertise in climatology;
- 19 (B) one member with expertise in this state's
- 20 economy;
- (C) one member with expertise in land management
- 22 and natural resource maintenance; and
- (D) one member representing the tourism
- 24 industry.

- 1 (d) A public member of the council is entitled to
- 2 reimbursement of the travel expenses incurred by the member while
- 3 conducting the business of the council, as provided by the General
- 4 Appropriations Act.
- 5 (e) The House Committee on Environmental Regulation and the
- 6 Senate Committee on Natural Resources and Economic Development
- 7 shall provide personnel and administrative support to the council
- 8 as needed.
- 9 (f) The council shall conduct a study to:
- 10 (1) assess the current and potential effects of
- 11 climate change trends on the residents, natural resources, public
- 12 health, and economy of this state;
- 13 (2) estimate the costs to this state of adverse
- 14 effects associated with climate change;
- 15 (3) research measures for preventing or mitigating the
- 16 effects of flooding, erosion, drought, and wildfires that may be
- 17 caused or worsened by climate change; and
- 18 (4) recommend legislation or other regulations to
- 19 minimize the adverse impact of climate change on this state.
- 20 (g) The council shall hold public hearings in various parts
- 21 of this state to gather information related to the council's study.
- (h) Not later than January 1, 2023, the council shall
- 23 prepare and submit a report to the legislature containing the
- 24 findings of the study described in Subsection (f) of this section.
- 25 (i) The council is abolished and this Act expires September
- 26 1, 2023.
- 27 SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2022, the lieutenant

- 1 governor and the speaker of the house of representatives shall
- 2 appoint members to the Climate Change Impact Assessment Council as
- 3 required by this Act.
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 5 last day of the legislative session.
