1	AN ACT
2	relating to an early voting ballot voted by mail.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 84.032(c), Election Code, is amended to
5	read as follows:
6	(c) An applicant may submit a request after the close of
7	early voting by personal appearance by appearing in person and:
8	(1) returning the ballot to be voted by mail to the
9	early voting clerk; or
10	(2) executing an affidavit that the applicant:
11	(A) has not received the ballot to be voted by
12	mail; [or]
13	(B) never requested a ballot to be voted by mail <u>;</u>
14	or
15	(C) received notice of a defect under Section
16	87.0271(b) or 87.0411(b).
17	SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 87, Election Code, is
18	amended by adding Section 87.0271 to read as follows:
19	Sec. 87.0271. OPPORTUNITY TO CORRECT DEFECT: SIGNATURE
20	VERIFICATION COMMITTEE. (a) This section applies to an early
21	voting ballot voted by mail:
22	(1) for which the voter did not sign the carrier
23	<pre>envelope certificate;</pre>
24	(2) for which it cannot immediately be determined

- 1 whether the signature on the carrier envelope certificate is that
- 2 of the voter;
- 3 (3) missing any required statement of residence; or
- 4 (4) containing incomplete information with respect to
- 5 a witness.
- 6 (b) Not later than the second business day after discovering
- 7 <u>a defect described by Subsection (a) and before deciding whether to</u>
- 8 accept or reject a timely delivered ballot under Section 87.027,
- 9 the signature verification committee shall:
- 10 (1) return the carrier envelope to the voter by mail,
- 11 if the signature verification committee determines that it would be
- 12 possible to correct the defect and return the carrier envelope
- 13 before the time the polls are required to close on election day; or
- 14 (2) notify the voter of the defect by telephone or
- 15 e-mail and inform the voter that the voter may request to have the
- 16 voter's application to vote by mail canceled in the manner
- 17 described by Section 84.032 or come to the early voting clerk's
- 18 office in person not later than the sixth day after election day to
- 19 correct the defect.
- 20 (c) If the signature verification committee takes an action
- 21 described by Subsection (b), the committee must take either action
- 22 described by that subsection with respect to each ballot in the
- 23 election to which this section applies.
- 24 <u>(d) A poll watcher is entitled to observe an action taken</u>
- 25 under Subsection (b).
- 26 (e) The secretary of state may prescribe any procedures
- 27 necessary to implement this section.

- 1 (f) Notwithstanding any other law, a ballot may not be
- 2 finally rejected for a reason listed in Section 87.041(b)(1), (2),
- 3 or (6) before the seventh day after election day.
- 4 SECTION 3. Subchapter C, Chapter 87, Election Code, is
- 5 amended by adding Section 87.0411 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 87.0411. OPPORTUNITY TO CORRECT DEFECT: EARLY VOTING
- 7 BALLOT BOARD. (a) This section applies to an early voting ballot
- 8 voted by mail:
- 9 <u>(1) for which the voter did not sign the carrier</u>
- 10 envelope certificate;
- 11 (2) for which it cannot immediately be determined
- 12 whether the signature on the carrier envelope certificate is that
- 13 of the voter;
- 14 (3) missing any required statement of residence; or
- 15 (4) containing incomplete information with respect to
- 16 <u>a witness.</u>
- 17 (b) Not later than the second business day after discovering
- 18 a defect described by Subsection (a) and before deciding whether to
- 19 accept or reject a timely delivered ballot under Section 87.041,
- 20 the early voting ballot board shall:
- 21 (1) return the carrier envelope to the voter by mail,
- 22 <u>if the early voting ballot board determines that it would be</u>
- 23 possible to correct the defect and return the carrier envelope
- 24 before the time the polls are required to close on election day; or
- 25 (2) notify the voter of the defect by telephone or
- 26 <u>e-mail</u> and inform the voter that the voter may request to have the
- 27 voter's application to vote by mail canceled in the manner

- 4 (c) If the early voting ballot board takes an action
- 5 described by Subsection (b), the board must take either action
- 6 described by that subsection with respect to each ballot in the
- 7 election to which this section applies.
- 8 (d) A poll watcher is entitled to observe an action taken
- 9 under Subsection (b).
- 10 (e) The secretary of state may prescribe any procedures
- 11 necessary to implement this section.
- 12 (f) Notwithstanding any other law, a ballot may not be
- 13 finally rejected for a reason listed in Section 87.041(b)(1), (2),
- 14 or (6) before the seventh day after election day.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 16 last day of the legislative session.
