5	SECTION 1. Subtitle F, Title 10, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 2275 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 2275. MANDATORY COVID-19 VACCINATIONS PROHIBITED
8	Sec. 2275.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Company" has the meaning assigned by Section
10	808.001.
11	(2) "Political subdivision" means a county,
12	municipality, school district, special purpose district, or other
13	subdivision of state government that has jurisdiction limited to a
14	geographic portion of the state.
15	(3) "State agency" has the meaning assigned by Section
16	609.001.
17	Sec. 2275.002. PROVISION REQUIRED IN CONTRACT. A state
18	agency or political subdivision may not enter into a contract with a
19	company for goods or services unless the contract contains a
20	written verification from the company that it does not, and will not
21	during the term of the contract, require, as a condition of
22	employment, an employee to receive any COVID-19 vaccination.
23	SECTION 2. Chapter 2275, Government Code, as added by this
24	Act, applies only to a contract entered into on or after the

- 1 effective date of this Act. A contract entered into before that
- 2 date is governed by the law in effect on the date the contract was
- 3 entered into, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 4 purpose.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 6 last day of the legislative session.
