

1 SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, Memories of a life filled with joyful times and
3 meaningful accomplishments remain to comfort the family and friends
4 of Linda Gay Galbraith Wall of Magnolia, who passed away on July 20,
5 2020, at the age of 80; and

6 WHEREAS, The former Linda Galbraith was born in McCamey on
7 August 14, 1939, to Cecil and Lucy Galbraith; her family followed
8 her father's work in the oil and gas business, residing in Texas,
9 Oklahoma, and Kansas, before settling in the Houston suburb of West
10 University Place, where she attended Lamar High School; as an
11 active member of the youth ministry at West University Baptist
12 Church, she met her future husband, Joe Wall; the pair continued to
13 cross paths due to their involvement in the church, and after years
14 of blossoming romance, they exchanged wedding vows on August 20,
15 1960; the couple were blessed with two sons, Scot and Christopher,
16 and five precious grandchildren, Marissa, Caleb, Angel, Tyler, and
17 Thomas; and

18 WHEREAS, Over the course of their 60 years of marriage,
19 Mr. and Mrs. Wall were devoted partners in life and in ministry;
20 after earning her bachelor's degree and teaching certificate from
21 Sam Houston State University, Mrs. Wall taught in public schools to
22 support her husband while he completed his college and seminary
23 studies; she went on to minister alongside him at churches and
24 schools in Texas and in Colorado, and she served as a leader and a

1 spiritual mentor to a host of women's ministries; she also taught
2 English at Colorado Christian University while her husband served
3 as the university's president in the 1980s, and during the
4 following decade, she became engaged in a worldwide mission
5 ministry that involved training pastors' wives and other women in
6 the former Soviet Union; she and her husband later relocated to
7 Magnolia, where she contributed significantly to the women's
8 ministry at the new Magnolia Bible Church; and

9 WHEREAS, Linda Wall was beloved for her steadfast faith, her
10 warmth and kindness, and her generosity of spirit, and she will
11 forever hold a cherished place in the hearts of those she leaves
12 behind; now, therefore, be it

13 RESOLVED, That the 87th Legislature of the State of Texas,
14 3rd Called Session, hereby pay tribute to the life of Linda Gay
15 Galbraith Wall and extend sincere sympathy to her family and
16 friends; and, be it further

17 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
18 prepared for her family and that when the Texas House of
19 Representatives and Senate adjourn this day, they do so in memory of
20 Linda Wall.
