A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to the creation of the Texas Electricity Supply Chain
3	Mapping Committee.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 38, Utilities Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter F to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER F. TEXAS ELECTRICITY SUPPLY CHAIN MAPPING COMMITTEE
8	Sec. 38.201. TEXAS ELECTRICITY SUPPLY CHAIN MAPPING
9	COMMITTEE. (a) The Texas Electricity Supply Chain Mapping
10	Committee is a committee to:
11	(1) map the state's electricity supply chain;
12	(2) identify critical infrastructure sources along
13	the electricity supply chain;
14	(3) make recommendations on measures to prepare
15	facilities that provide electric and gas service to maintain
16	service in an extreme weather event; and
17	(4) designate priority service needs in extreme
18	weather events.
19	(b) The committee is composed of:
20	(1) the executive director of the Railroad Commission
21	of Texas;
22	(2) the executive director of the commission;
23	(3) the president and chief executive office of the
2/1	Flectric Peliability Council of Texas, and

- 1 (4) the chief of the Texas Division of Emergency
- 2 Management.
- 3 (c) Each member of the committee may designate a personal
- 4 representative from the member's organization to represent the
- 5 member on the committee, but that designation does not relieve the
- 6 member of responsibility for the acts and omissions of the
- 7 representative.
- 8 (d) The executive director of the commission shall serve as
- 9 chairman, and the executive director of the Railroad Commission
- 10 shall serve as vice-chairman of the committee.
- Sec. 38.202. ADMINISTRATION. (a) The committee shall meet
- 12 not less than once each calendar quarter at a time determined by the
- 13 committee and at the call of the chairman.
- 14 (c) Each member of the committee may receive reimbursement
- 15 for actual and necessary expenses in carrying out committee
- 16 responsibilities as provided by legislative appropriations. Each
- 17 member who is a representative of a state entity shall be reimbursed
- 18 from the money budgeted to the member's state entity.
- (d) Each entity listed in Sections 38.201(b)(1) through (4)
- 20 of this code that is represented on the committee shall provide
- 21 staff as necessary to assist the committee in carrying out its
- 22 responsibilities.
- 23 (e) The committee is subject to Chapter 2001, Government
- 24 Code, Chapter 551, Government Code, and Chapter 552, Government
- 25 Code.
- Sec. 38.203. POWERS AND DUTIES OF COMMITTEE. (a) The
- 27 committee shall:

- 1 (1) map the state's electricity supply chain in order
- 2 to designate priority electricity service needs in extreme weather
- 3 events;
- 4 (2) identify and designate the sources in the supply
- 5 chain necessary to operate critical infrastructure, as that term is
- 6 defined in Section 421.001, Government Code;
- 7 (3) develop a communication system between the
- 8 critical infrastructure sources, the commission, and the Electric
- 9 Reliability Council of Texas to ensure that electricity supply is
- 10 prioritized to those sources in an extreme weather event;
- 11 (4) make recommendations on measures to prepare
- 12 facilities that provide electric and gas service to maintain
- 13 service in an extreme weather event; and
- 14 (5) publish a report required by Section 38.204 of
- 15 this code.
- 16 (b) The commission shall create and maintain a database
- 17 identifying the critical infrastructure sources with priority
- 18 electricity needs during an extreme weather event. The database
- 19 shall be updated annually.
- Sec. 38.204. ELECTRIC SUPPLY MAPPING REPORT. The committee
- 21 shall publish not later than January 1, 2022, a report to the
- 22 Governor, Lt. Governor, Speaker, and Legislature covering the
- 23 activities and findings of the committee. The report must:
- 24 (1) provide a detailed map of the electricity supply
- 25 chain and identify those sources designated as necessary to operate
- 26 critical infrastructure;
- 27 (2) recommend a clear and thorough communication

- 1 system between the entities listed in Sections 38.201(b)(1) through
- 2 (4) of this code and the critical infrastructure sources to ensure
- 3 that electricity supply is prioritized to those sources during
- 4 <u>extreme weather events.</u>
- 5 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
