- 2 SECTION 2. Section 2002.007, Insurance Code, as added by
- 3 this Act, applies only to an insurance policy delivered, issued for
- 4 delivery, or renewed on or after February 13, 2021.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
