SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 29, Education Code, 5 amended by adding Section 29.0164 to read as follows: 6

Sec. 29.0164. LIMITATION PERIOD FOR FILING COMPLAINT AND 7

REQUESTING SPECIAL EDUCATION DUE PROCESS HEARING. The commissioner 8

9 or agency may not adopt or enforce a rule that establishes a shorter

period for filing a due process complaint alleging a violation of 10

state or federal special education laws and requesting an impartial 11

12 due process hearing than the maximum timeline designated under 20

U.S.C. Sections 1415(b)(6) and (f)(3). 13

SECTION 2. Section 29.0164, Education Code, as added by 14

this Act, applies only to a complaint filed and an impartial due 15

process hearing requested on or after the effective date of this 16

A complaint filed and an impartial due process hearing 17

requested before the effective date of this Act are governed by the 18

law in effect at the time the complaint was filed and the impartial 19

due process hearing was requested, and the former law is continued 20

21 in effect for that purpose.

22 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date

23 of this Act, the commissioner of education shall amend rules as

necessary to comply with Section 29.0164, Education Code, as added 24
