## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 8 Sec. 103.005. REQUIRED NOTICE. (a) A hospital or health
- 9 care facility at which abortions are performed, including a

- 11 post a sign in a location easily visible to each physician, nurse,
- 12 staff member, or employee of the hospital or facility who performs

3	(1) at least 11 inches by 17 inches in size and written

7	(B) Spanish; and
8	(C) any other primary language spoken by 10
9	percent or more of the hospital or health care facility's
10	physicians, nurses, staff members, or employees who perform or
11	participate or may perform or participate in an abortion procedure.
12	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
