5	SECTION 1. Section 13.015, Parks and Wildlife Code, is
6	amended by amending Subsection (a-2) and adding Subsection (a-3) to
7	read as follows:
8	(a-2) The department shall waive the park entrance fee for a
9	resident of this state who is a first responder. In this
10	subsection, "first responder" means a person who is:
11	(1) a firefighter certified by the Texas Commission or
12	Fire Protection or by the State Firefighters' and Fire Marshals'
13	Association of Texas;
14	(2) an individual certified as emergency medical
15	services personnel by the Department of State Health Services;
16	(3) a municipal police officer;
17	(4) a sheriff, deputy sheriff, or reserve deputy
18	sheriff; or
19	(5) a constable, deputy constable, or reserve deputy
20	constable.
21	(a-3) The department may promote visits and enhance revenue
22	at parks, including amounts necessary for salaries, advertising,

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related expenses.

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- 1 SECTION 2. Section 13.018(a), Parks and Wildlife Code, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 (a) The following people may apply to the department for a
- 4 state parklands passport:
- 5 (1) a resident of this state who is 65 years old or
- 6 over who has resided in the state for six consecutive months
- 7 preceding the date of application for a parklands passport $[\frac{1}{2}]$
- 8 member of the United States armed forces on active duty who is 65
- 9 years old or over, or any other individual in a category that the
- 10 commission by rule designates as a resident of this state who is 65
- 11 years old or over;
- 12 (2) an active duty member or [a] veteran of the armed
- 13 services of the United States, the Texas Army National Guard, the
- 14 Texas Air National Guard, or the Texas State Guard [who, as a result
- 15 of military service, has a service-connected disability, as defined
- 16 by the Veterans' Administration, consisting of the loss of the use
- 17 of a lower extremity or of a 60 percent disability rating and who is
- 18 receiving compensation from the United States because of the
- 19 disability]; and
- 20 (3) an individual who has a physical or mental
- 21 impairment that substantially limits one or more of the major life
- 22 activities of the individual.
