A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2	relating to the continuation and functions of the Texas Parks and
3	Wildlife Department.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

- 5 SECTION 1. Section 11.0111, Parks and Wildlife Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 11.0111. SUNSET PROVISION. The Parks and Wildlife
- 8 Department is subject to Chapter 325, Government Code (Texas Sunset
- 9 Act). Unless continued in existence as provided by that chapter,
- 10 the department is abolished September 1, 2033 [2021].
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 11.0126, Parks and Wildlife Code, is
- 12 amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (d) to
- 13 read as follows:

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- 14 (b) The training program must provide the person with
- 15 information regarding:
- 16 (1) the <u>law governing</u> [<u>legislation that created the</u>]
- 17 department operations [and the commission];
- 18 (2) the programs, functions, rules, and budget of
- 19 [operated by] the department;
- 20 (3) the scope of and limitations of the rulemaking
- 21 <u>authority</u> [the role and functions] of the <u>commission</u> [department];
- 22 (4) [the rules of the commission, with an emphasis on
- 23 the rules that relate to disciplinary and investigatory authority;
- 24 [(5) the current budget for the department;

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- 1 $\left[\frac{(6)}{(6)}\right]$ the results of the most recent formal audit of
- 2 the department;
- 3 (5) [(7)] the requirements of:
- 4 (A) <u>laws relating to [the]</u> open meetings, <u>public</u>
- 5 information, administrative procedure, and disclosing conflicts of
- 6 interest [law, Chapter 551, Government Code]; and
- 7 (B) [the public information law, Chapter 552,
- 8 Government Code;
- 9 [(C) the administrative procedure law, Chapter
- 10 2001, Government Code; and
- 11 [(D)] other laws <u>applicable to members of a state</u>
- 12 policymaking body in performing their duties [relating to public
- 13 officials, including conflict-of-interest laws]; and
- 14 (6) [(8)] any applicable ethics policies adopted by
- 15 the department or the Texas Ethics Commission.
- 16 <u>(d) The director shall create a training manual that</u>
- 17 includes the information required by Subsection (b). The director
- 18 shall distribute a copy of the training manual annually to each
- 19 member of the commission. Each member of the commission shall sign
- 20 and submit to the director a statement acknowledging that the
- 21 member received and has reviewed the training manual.
- 22 SECTION 3. The heading to Section 11.0161, Parks and
- 23 Wildlife Code, is amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 11.0161. NOTIFICATION OF COMMISSION ACTIVITIES [+
- 25 **COMPLAINTS**].
- SECTION 4. Subchapter B, Chapter 11, Parks and Wildlife
- 27 Code, is amended by adding Section 11.0165 to read as follows:

- 1 Sec. 11.0165. COMPLAINTS. (a) The department shall
- 2 <u>maintain a system to promptly and efficiently act on complaints</u>
- 3 filed with the department. The department shall maintain
- 4 information about parties to the complaint, the subject matter of
- 5 the complaint, a summary of the results of the review or
- 6 investigation of the complaint, and its disposition.
- 7 (b) The department shall make information available
- 8 describing its procedures for complaint investigation and
- 9 resolution.
- 10 (c) The department shall periodically notify the complaint
- 11 parties of the status of the complaint until final disposition
- 12 unless the notice would jeopardize an investigation.
- SECTION 5. Section 11.104, Parks and Wildlife Code, is
- 14 amended by amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsections (f) and
- 15 (g) to read as follows:
- 16 (c) Based on the analysis made under Subsection (a), the
- 17 department shall prepare a land and water resources conservation
- 18 and recreation plan. [The plan must include criteria for
- 19 determining how to meet the state's conservation and recreation
- 20 needs.] The department shall revise the plan as necessary to
- 21 reflect changes in the inventory developed under Section 11.103.
- 22 The plan must include:
- 23 <u>(1) criteria for determining how to meet the state's</u>
- 24 conservation and recreation needs; and
- 25 (2) measures of the effectiveness of the department in
- 26 meeting the goals and objectives of the plan, including, where
- 27 possible, quantifiable measures.

- 1 (f) Every other year the department shall evaluate progress
- 2 towards achieving the goals and objectives of the plan prepared
- 3 under Subsection (c). The department's evaluation must:
- 4 (1) include the effectiveness measures under
- 5 Subsection (c)(2); and
- 6 (2) identify:
- 7 (A) the goals and objectives met by the
- 8 department; and
- 9 (B) reasons for any unmet goals or objectives.
- 10 (g) On completion of an evaluation under Subsection (f), the
- 11 department shall develop and implement practices designed to
- 12 improve progress towards meeting the goals and objectives of the
- 13 plan.
- 14 SECTION 6. Subchapter B, Chapter 12, Parks and Wildlife
- 15 Code, is amended by adding Section 12.1025 to read as follows:
- Sec. 12.1025. RISK-BASED INSPECTIONS OF COMMERCIAL OR
- 17 OCCUPATIONAL LICENSED ACTIVITIES. (a) In this section,
- 18 "commercial or occupational licensed activity" means an activity
- 19 for which a license, permit, or other authorization is required by
- 20 this code or rules adopted under this code that results in income or
- 21 other remuneration for the license holder. The term does not
- 22 include a hunting license issued under Chapter 42 or a fishing
- 23 license issued under Chapter 46.
- (b) The commission by rule shall adopt a policy to guide the
- 25 prioritization of inspections of commercial or occupational
- 26 licensed activity based on risk to the state's natural resources.
- 27 (c) The policy adopted under this section must require that

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   the department:
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               (1) identify the licenses, permits, and other
   authorizations for commercial or occupational licensed activity
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   issued by the department that require on-site inspections;
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               (2) develop an assessment tool for determining the
   appropriate frequency and intensity of department inspections of
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   commercial or occupational licensed activity, based on key risk
   factors and indications of increased or decreased risk, such as
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   repeated or remedied violations and failed or passed inspections;
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   and
               (3) document all inspections of commercial or
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   occupational licensed activity and the results of those inspections
   and make the documentation available to all employees whose job
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   descriptions include the regulation of commercial or occupational
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   licensed activity.
          SECTION 7. Section 24.001(12), Parks and Wildlife Code, is
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   amended to read as follows:

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- 1 SECTION 8. Section 24.051(11), Parks and Wildlife Code, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 (11) "Underserved population" means any group of
- 4 people that is:
- 5 (A) low income or inner city, as determined by
- 6 the last census;
- 7 <u>(B)</u> [, or] minority<u>;</u>
- 8 (C) youth, including youth at risk and youth with
- 9 a physical, developmental, or intellectual disability or mental
- 10 <u>illness;</u>[, physically or mentally challenged youth at risk, youth,]
- 11 or
- 12 (D) female.
- SECTION 9. Section 31.044, Parks and Wildlife Code, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 31.044. INSPECTIONS. (a) In this section, "license
- 16 holder" means a person holding a license under Section 31.041.
- 17 (b) A license holder [dealer, distributor, or manufacturer]
- 18 may not refuse to allow the department or a peace officer to inspect
- 19 a vessel, outboard motor, or records relating to the possession,
- 20 origination, ownership, or transfer of a vessel or outboard motor
- 21 at a dealership or distributor's or manufacturer's place of
- 22 business during normal business hours.
- 23 (c) The commission by rule shall adopt a policy to guide the
- 24 prioritization of inspections of license holders based on risk to
- 25 the state's natural resources.
- 26 (d) The policy adopted under this section must require that
- 27 <u>the department:</u>

- 1 (1) determine the conditions under which an on-site
- 2 inspection of a license holder by the department is appropriate;
- 3 (2) develop an assessment tool for determining the
- 4 appropriate frequency and intensity of department inspections of
- 5 <u>license holders</u>, based on key risk factors and indications of
- 6 increased or decreased risk, such as repeated or remedied
- 7 violations and failed or passed inspections; and
- 8 (3) document all license holder inspections and the
- 9 results of those inspections and make the documentation available
- 10 to all employees whose job descriptions include the regulation of
- 11 <u>license holders.</u>
- (e) The policy adopted under this section may be combined
- 13 with a policy adopted under Section 12.1025.
- 14 SECTION 10. Sections 42.012(b) and (c), Parks and Wildlife
- 15 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 16 (b) The commission may set a lower fee or waive the fee or
- 17 license requirement for a resident who is under 17 years old, 65
- 18 years old or older, or participating in an event that is sponsored
- 19 or co-sponsored by the department [Texas Parks and Wildlife
- 20 Department] with the approval of the [executive] director. The
- 21 commission shall waive the fee for a qualified [disabled] veteran
- 22 with a disability and for a resident on active duty as a member of
- 23 the United States military forces, the Texas Army National Guard,
- 24 the Texas Air National Guard, or the Texas State Guard.
- (c) "Qualified [disabled] veteran with a disability" means
- 26 a veteran with a service connected disability, as defined by the
- 27 United States Department of Veterans Affairs, consisting of the

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- 1 loss of the use of a lower extremity or of a disability rating of 50
- 2 percent or more and who is receiving compensation from the United
- 3 States for the disability.
- 4 SECTION 11. Section 46.002, Parks and Wildlife Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 46.002. EXEMPTIONS. (a) A license issued under this
- 7 chapter is not required of a person:
- 8 (1) who is a resident and whose birth date is before
- 9 January 1, 1931;
- 10 (2) who is a nonresident, if the person's birth date is
- 11 before September 1, 1930, and the person's state of residence
- 12 grants a similar age exemption to Texas residents;
- 13 (3) with a mental illness or developmental or
- 14 <u>intellectual disability</u> who is <u>engaged</u> [mentally disabled and who
- 15 <u>is engaging</u>] in recreational fishing as part of medically approved
- 16 therapy[, and who is fishing] under the immediate supervision of
- 17 personnel approved or employed by a hospital, residence, or school
- 18 for [mentally disabled] persons with mental illnesses or
- 19 developmental or intellectual disabilities;
- 20 (4) with a mental illness or developmental or
- 21 <u>intellectual disability</u> who is [mentally retarded and is] engaged
- 22 in recreational fishing under the immediate supervision of a person
- 23 who:
- 24 (A) holds a license issued under this chapter;
- 25 and
- 26 (B) <u>if not a member of the family of the person</u>
- 27 with a mental illness or developmental or intellectual disability,

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- 1 has the permission of the [mentally retarded person's] family head
- 2 or legal guardian of the person with a mental illness or
- 3 <u>developmental</u> or <u>intellectual</u> disability to take the [mentally
- 4 retarded person with a mental illness or developmental or
- 5 intellectual disability fishing [if the person is not a member of
- 6 the family of the mentally retarded person]; or
- 7 (5) who is participating in an event that is sponsored
- 8 or co-sponsored by the department [Texas Parks and Wildlife
- 9 Department] with the approval of the director [Executive Director].
- 10 (b) The [mentally disabled] person with a mental illness or
- 11 <u>developmental</u> or intellectual disability who is recreationally
- 12 fishing under Subsection (a)(3) shall carry an authorization
- 13 identifying the entity supplying the service. This authorization
- 14 may be in the form of a tag that contains the name of the sponsoring
- 15 entity.
- 16 (c) A [mentally retarded] person with a mental illness or
- 17 developmental or intellectual disability who is engaged in
- 18 recreational fishing under Subsection (a)(4) must carry a note from
- 19 a doctor stating that the person has been diagnosed with a mental
- 20 illness or developmental or intellectual disability [as mentally
- 21 retarded].
- SECTION 12. Section 46.004(c), Parks and Wildlife Code, is
- 23 amended to read as follows:
- (c) The commission shall waive the fee for a qualified
- 25 [disabled] veteran with a disability as defined by Section 42.012
- 26 and for a resident on active duty as a member of the United States
- 27 military forces, the Texas Army National Guard, the Texas Air

- 1 National Guard, or the Texas State Guard.
- 2 SECTION 13. Chapter 86, Parks and Wildlife Code, is amended
- 3 by adding Section 86.0215 to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 86.0215. INSPECTIONS. (a) In this section, "permit
- 5 holder" means a person holding a permit under Section 86.006.
- 6 (b) The commission by rule shall adopt a policy to guide the
- 7 prioritization of inspections of permit holders based on risk to
- 8 the state's natural resources.
- 9 (c) The policy adopted under this section must require that
- 10 the department:
- 11 (1) determine the conditions under which an on-site
- 12 inspection of a permit holder by the department is appropriate;
- 13 (2) develop an assessment tool for determining the
- 14 appropriate frequency and intensity of department inspections of
- 15 permit holders, based on key risk factors and indications of
- 16 increased or decreased risk, such as repeated or remedied
- 17 violations and failed or passed inspections; and
- 18 (3) document all inspections of permit holders and the
- 19 results of those inspections and make the documentation available
- 20 to all employees whose job descriptions include the regulation of
- 21 permit holders.
- 22 (d) The policy adopted under this section may be combined
- 23 with a policy adopted under Section 12.1025.
- 24 SECTION 14. Sections 11.0161(b), (c), (d), and (e), Parks
- 25 and Wildlife Code, are repealed.
- 26 SECTION 15. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
