- 5 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the Healthy Business
- 6 Act.
- 7 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,
- 8 is amended by adding Section 32.02473 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 32.02473. EXPANDED ELIGIBILITY FOR MEDICAL
- 10 ASSISTANCE. (a) Notwithstanding any other law, the commission
- 11 shall provide medical assistance to all persons who apply for that
- 12 <u>assistance</u> and for whom federal matching money is available.
- 13 (b) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules necessary
- 14 to implement this section.
- 15 SECTION 3. Section 32.02473, Human Resources Code, as added
- 16 by this Act, applies only to an initial determination or
- 17 recertification of eligibility of a person for medical assistance
- 18 under Chapter 32, Human Resources Code, made on or after the date
- 19 the section is implemented, regardless of the date the person
- 20 applied for that assistance.
- 21 SECTION 4. As soon as possible after the effective date of
- 22 this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 23 Services Commission shall take all necessary actions to expand
- 24 eligibility for medical assistance under Chapter 32, Human

- 1 Resources Code, in accordance with Section 32.02473, Human
- 2 Resources Code, as added by this Act, including notifying
- 3 appropriate federal agencies of that expanded eligibility.
- 4 SECTION 5. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 5 a state agency determines that any other waiver or authorization
- 6 from a federal agency is necessary for implementation of that
- 7 provision, the agency affected by the provision shall request the
- 8 waiver or authorization and may delay implementing that provision
- 9 until the waiver or authorization is granted.
- 10 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
