- 6 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the Lisa Torry Smith
- 7 Act.
- 8 SECTION 2. Subchapter I, Chapter 545, Transportation Code,
- 9 is amended by adding Section 545.428 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 545.428. MOTOR VEHICLE ACCIDENT INVOLVING PEDESTRIAN
- 11 OR OTHER VULNERABLE ROAD USER WITHIN AREA OF CROSSWALK; OFFENSE.
- 12 (a) In this section:
- 13 (1) "Electric personal assistive mobility device" has
- 14 the meaning assigned by Section 551.201.
- 15 (2) "Golf cart" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 16 551.401.
- 17 (3) "Motor-assisted scooter" has the meaning assigned
- 18 <u>by Section 551.351.</u>
- 19 (4) "Neighborhood electric vehicle" has the meaning
- 20 assigned by Section 551.301.
- 21 (b) A person commits an offense if the person with criminal
- 22 negligence:
- 23 (1) operates a motor vehicle within the area of a
- 24 crosswalk; and

- 1 (2) causes bodily injury to a pedestrian or a person
- 2 operating a bicycle, motor-assisted scooter, electronic personal
- 3 assistive mobility device, neighborhood electric vehicle, or golf
- 4 cart.
- 5 (c) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor,
- 6 except that the offense is a state jail felony if the person
- 7 described by Subsection (b)(2) suffered serious bodily injury.
- 8 (d) It is an affirmative defense to prosecution under this
- 9 section that, at the time of the offense, the person described by
- 10 Subsection (b)(2) was violating a provision of this subtitle
- 11 relating to walking, movement, or operation in a crosswalk or on a
- 12 roadway.
- 13 (e) If conduct that constitutes an offense under this
- 14 section also constitutes an offense under any other law, the actor
- 15 may be prosecuted under this section, the other law, or both.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
