- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 1102.001, Occupations Code is amended as
- 5 follows:
- 6 Sec. 1102.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
- 7 (1) "Apprentice inspector" means a person who is in
- 8 training under the direct supervision of a professional inspector
- 9 or a real estate inspector to become qualified to perform real
- 10 estate inspections.
- 11 (2) "Broker" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 12 1101.002
- 13 (3) "Commission" means the Texas Real Estate
- 14 Commission.
- 15 (4) "Committee" means the Texas Real Estate Inspector
- 16 Committee.
- 17 (5) "Qualifying[Core] real estate inspection course"
- 18 means an educational course approved by the commission that relates
- 19 to real estate inspection, including a course on structural items,
- 20 electrical items, mechanical systems, plumbing systems, roofing,
- 21 business, law, standards of practice, report writing, appliances,
- 22 or ethics.
- 23 (6) "Inspector" means a person who holds a license
- 24 under this chapter.

- 1 (7) "License" means an apprentice inspector license,
- 2 real estate inspector license, or professional inspector license.
- 3 (8) "Professional inspector" means a person who
- 4 represents to the public that the person is trained and qualified to
- 5 perform a real estate inspection and who accepts employment to
- 6 perform a real estate inspection for a buyer or seller of real
- 7 property.
- 8 (9) "Real estate inspection" means a written or oral
- 9 opinion as to the condition of the improvements to real property,
- 10 including structural items, electrical items, mechanical systems,
- 11 plumbing systems, or equipment.
- 12 (10) "Real estate inspector" means a person <u>licensed</u>
- 13 before September 1, 2022 who represents to the public that the
- 14 person is trained and qualified to perform a real estate inspection
- 15 under the indirect supervision of a professional inspector and who
- 16 accepts employment to perform a real estate inspection for a buyer
- 17 or seller of real property.
- 18 (11) "Salesperson" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 19 1101.002.
- 20 SECTION 2. Section 1102.109, Occupations Code is amended as
- 21 follows:
- Sec. 1102.109. ELIGIBILITY FOR PROFESSIONAL INSPECTOR
- 23 LICENSE. To be eligible for a professional inspector license, an
- 24 applicant must:
- 25 (1) at the time of application have:
- 26 (A) held an apprentice [a real estate] inspector
- 27 license for at least 12 months; and

- 1 (B) performed at least 175 real estate
- 2 inspections under indirect supervision;
- 3 (C) submit evidence satisfactory to the
- 4 commission of successful completion of at least 120[40] classroom
- 5 hours of qualifying[core] real estate inspection courses[, in
- 6 addition to the hours required by Section 1102.108];
- 7 (D) demonstrate competence based on the
- 8 examination under Subchapter D; and
- 9 (E) satisfy the commission as to the applicant's
- 10 honesty, trustworthiness, integrity, and competence
- 11 SECTION 3. Section 1102.111, Occupations Code is amended as
- 12 follows:
- Sec. 1102.111. SUBSTITUTE REQUIREMENTS. (a) The
- 14 commission by rule shall provide for substitution of relevant
- 15 experience and additional education in place of:
- 16 (1) the number of real estate inspections required for
- 17 licensing; and
- 18 (2) the requirement that an applicant be [÷
- $\frac{(A)}{(A)}$ ] licensed as an apprentice inspector before
- 20 being licensed as a real estate inspector[+ or
- 21 (B) licensed as a real estate inspector before
- 22 being licensed as a professional inspector].
- 23 (b) Rules adopted under Subsection (a) may not require an

- 3 (C) have more than seven years of relevant experience.
- 4 SECTION 4. Section 1102.151, Occupations Code is amended as
- 5 Follows:
- 6 Sec. 1102.151. CONTENT OF EXAMINATION. (a) A license
- 7 examination must evaluate competence in the subject matter of each
- 8 required qualifying[core] real estate inspection course.
- 9 (b) The commission shall:
- 10 (1) prescribe each license examination; and
- 11 (2) prepare or contract for the examination
- SECTION 5. Section 1102.205(b), Occupations Code is amended
- 13 as follows:
- 14 (b) As a prerequisite for renewal of a real estate inspector
- 15 license, professional inspector license, or apprentice inspector
- 16 license, the inspector must participate in the continuing education
- 17 program and submit evidence satisfactory to the commission of
- 18 successful completion of at least 16 classroom hours of
- 19 qualifying[core] real estate inspection courses or continuing
- 20 education courses for each year of the license period preceding the
- 21 renewal.
- 22 SECTION 6. Section 1102.352(a) as is amended follows:
- Sec. 1102.352. PAYMENTS INTO FUND. (a) In addition to any
- 24 other fees required by this chapter, the commission shall collect a
- 25 fee of \$10 to deposit to the credit of the fund from an applicant for
- 26 an original license.[a person who passes a license examination must
- 27 pay a fee not to exceed \$200. The commission shall deposit the fee

- 1 to the credit of the fund before issuing the license.]
- 2 SECTION 7. Chapter 1102, Occupation Code is amended by
- 3 adding Section 1102.409 as follows:
- 4 Sec. 1102.409. REAPPLYING AFTER REVOCATION, SURRENDER, OR
- 5 DENIAL. A person whose license as been revoked, a person who has
- 6 surrendered a license issued by the commission, or a person whose
- 7 application for a license has been denied after a hearing under
- 8 Section 1101.657 may not apply to the commission for a license
- 9 before the second anniversary of the date of the revocation,
- 10 <u>surrender</u>, or denial.
- 11 SECTION 8. Sections 1102.108 and 1102.110(a), and
- 12 1102.251(a)(2), Occupations Code are repealed.
- 13 SECTION 9. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 14 an application for a license submitted to the Texas Real Estate
- 15 Commission on or after September 1, 2021. An application for a
- 16 license submitted before that date is governed by the law in effect
- 17 on the date the application was submitted, and the former law is
- 18 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 19 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
