A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the governing body of the independent organization

- 3 certified to manage the ERCOT power region.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 39.151, Utilities Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (g) and adding Subsections (g-2) and (g-3) to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (g) To maintain certification as an independent
- 9 organization under this section, an organization's governing body,
- 10 other than the ex officio members listed in this subsection, must be
- 11 composed of persons specified by this section who represent the
- 12 various geographic regions of this state, who have expertise in the
- 13 <u>field of power generation or transmission and distribution,</u> and <u>who</u>
- 14 <u>are</u> selected in accordance with formal bylaws or protocols of the
- 15 organization. The bylaws or protocols must be approved by the
- 16 commission and must reflect the input of the commission. The bylaws
- 17 must specify the process by which appropriate stakeholders elect
- 18 members and, for unaffiliated members, prescribe professional
- 19 qualifications for selection as a member. The bylaws must require
- 20 the use of a professional search firm to identify candidates for
- 21 membership of unaffiliated members. The process must allow for
- 22 commission input in identifying candidates. The governing body
- 23 must be composed of:
- 24 (1) the chairman of the commission as an ex officio

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1 nonvoting member;
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- 2 (2) the counsellor as an ex officio voting member
- 3 representing residential and small commercial consumer interests;
- 4 (3) the chief executive officer of the independent
- 5 organization as an ex officio voting member;
- 6 (4) six market participants elected by their
- 7 respective market segments to serve one-year terms, with:
- 8 (A) one representing independent generators;
- 9 (B) one representing investor-owned utilities;
- 10 (C) one representing power marketers;
- 11 (D) one representing retail electric providers;
- 12 (E) one representing municipally owned
- 13 utilities; and
- 14 (F) one representing electric cooperatives;
- 15 (5) one member representing industrial consumer
- 16 interests and elected by the industrial consumer market segment to
- 17 serve a one-year term;
- 18 (6) one member representing large commercial consumer
- 19 interests selected in accordance with the bylaws to serve a
- 20 one-year term; and
- 21 (7) five members unaffiliated with any market segment
- 22 and selected by the other members of the governing body to serve
- 23 three-year terms.
- 24 <u>(g-2)</u> To qualify to serve as a member of the governing body
- 25 under Subsection (g)(4), (5), (6), or (7), a person must be a
- 26 resident of this state.
- 27 (g-3) To maintain certification as an independent

- 1 organization under this section, an organization's chief executive
- 2 officer must be a resident of this state.
- 3 SECTION 2. (a) An independent organization certified under
- 4 Section 39.151, Utilities Code, by the Public Utility Commission of
- 5 Texas before September 1, 2021, shall hold elections and select new
- 6 members as needed to modify the organization's governing body to
- 7 comply with Section 39.151, Utilities Code, as amended by this Act,
- 8 as soon as practicable, but not later than September 1, 2022.
- 9 (b) An independent organization certified under Section
- 10 39.151, Utilities Code, by the Public Utility Commission of Texas
- 11 before September 1, 2021, shall ensure that the chief executive
- 12 officer of the organization is a resident of this state as soon as
- 13 practicable, but not later than September 1, 2022.
- 14 (c) After September 1, 2022, the Public Utility Commission
- 15 of Texas may decertify an independent organization whose governing
- 16 body or chief executive officer does not comply with Section
- 17 39.151, Utilities Code, as amended by this Act.
- 18 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
