A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the limitation on administration and use of certain
3	assessment instruments in public schools.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 39.023(a), Education Code, as effective
6	until September 1, 2021, is amended to read as follows:
7	(a) The agency shall adopt or develop appropriate
8	criterion-referenced assessment instruments designed to assess
9	essential knowledge and skills in reading, [writing,] mathematics,
10	[social studies,] and science. Except as provided by Subsection
11	(a-2), all students, other than students assessed under Subsection
12	(b) or (1) or exempted under Section 39.027, shall be assessed in:
13	(1) mathematics, annually in grades three through
14	eight;
15	(2) reading, annually in grades three through eight;
16	(3) [writing, including spelling and grammar, in
17	grades four and seven;
18	[(4) social studies, in grade eight;
19	$[\frac{(5)}{(5)}]$ science, in grades five and eight; and
20	$\underline{(4)}$ [$\overline{(6)}$] any other subject and grade required by
21	federal law.
22	SECTION 2. Section 39.023(a), Education Code, as effective
23	September 1, 2021, is amended to read as follows:
24	(a) The agency shall adopt or develop appropriate

- 1 criterion-referenced assessment instruments designed to assess
- 2 essential knowledge and skills in reading, mathematics, [social
- 3 studies, and science. Except as provided by Subsection (a-2), all
- 4 students, other than students assessed under Subsection (b) or (1)
- 5 or exempted under Section 39.027, shall be assessed in:
- 6 (1) mathematics, annually in grades three through 7 eight;
- 8 (2) reading, annually in grades three through eight;
- 9 (3) [social studies, in grade eight;
- 10 $\left[\frac{(4)}{}\right]$ science, in grades five and eight; and
- 11 $\underline{(4)}$ [$\overline{(5)}$] any other subject and grade required by
- 12 federal law.
- SECTION 3. Section 39.023(c), Education Code, is amended to
- 14 read as follows:
- 15 (c) The agency shall also adopt end-of-course assessment
- 16 instruments for secondary-level courses in Algebra I, biology, and
- 17 [English I, English II[, and United States history]. The Algebra I
- 18 end-of-course assessment instrument must be administered with the
- 19 aid of technology, but may include one or more parts that prohibit
- 20 the use of technology. The [English I and] English II end-of-course
- 21 assessment $\underline{instrument}$ [$\underline{instruments}$] must [\underline{each}] assess essential
- 22 knowledge and skills in both reading and writing and must provide a
- 23 single score. A school district shall comply with State Board of
- 24 Education rules regarding administration of the assessment
- 25 instruments listed in this subsection. If a student is in a special
- 26 education program under Subchapter A, Chapter 29, the student's
- 27 admission, review, and dismissal committee shall determine whether

- 1 any allowable modification is necessary in administering to the
- 2 student an assessment instrument required under this subsection.
- 3 The State Board of Education shall administer the assessment
- 4 instruments. An end-of-course assessment instrument may be
- 5 administered in multiple parts over more than one day. The State
- 6 Board of Education shall adopt a schedule for the administration of
- 7 end-of-course assessment instruments that complies with the
- 8 requirements of Subsection (c-3).
- 9 SECTION 4. Section 39.025(a-1), Education Code, is amended 10 to read as follows:
- (a-1) A student enrolled 11 in а college preparatory 12 mathematics or English language arts course under Section 28.014 who satisfies the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) college readiness 13 14 benchmarks prescribed by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating 15 Board under Section 51.334 on an assessment instrument designated by the coordinating board under that section administered at the 16 end of the college preparatory mathematics or English language arts 17 course satisfies the requirements concerning and is exempt from the 18 19 administration of the Algebra I or the [English I and] English II end-of-course assessment <u>instrument</u> [instruments], as applicable, 20 as prescribed by Section 39.023(c), even if the student did not 21 perform satisfactorily on a previous administration of 22 the applicable end-of-course assessment instrument. A student who 23 24 fails to perform satisfactorily on the assessment instrument designated by the coordinating board under Section 51.334 25 26 administered as provided by this subsection may retake that assessment instrument for purposes of this subsection or may take 27

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- 1 the appropriate end-of-course assessment instrument.
- 2 SECTION 5. Section 39.203(c), Education Code, is amended to
- 3 read as follows:
- 4 (c) In addition to the distinction designations described
- 5 by Subsections (a) and (b), a campus that satisfies the criteria
- 6 developed under Section 39.204 shall be awarded a distinction
- 7 designation by the commissioner for outstanding performance in
- 8 academic achievement in English language arts, mathematics, or
- 9 science[or social studies].
- 10 SECTION 6. Section 39.0238, Education Code, is repealed.
- SECTION 7. This Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022
- 12 school year.
- 13 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
