## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to claiming an exemption from required immunizations for
- 3 school students.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 161.0041(c), (d), and (e), Health and
- 6 Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (c) The department shall develop a blank affidavit form to
- 8 be used by a person claiming an exemption from a required
- 9 immunization under this section and make the affidavit form
- 10 <u>available</u> in a printable format on the department's Internet
- 11 website and in all school nurse offices. A person claiming an
- 12 exemption from a required immunization [under this section] may
- 13 <u>also</u> [<del>only</del>] obtain the affidavit form by submitting a written
- 14 request for the affidavit form to the department. A person may not
- 15 be required to provide any information to obtain a blank affidavit
- 16 form under this subsection.
- 17 (d) [The department shall develop a blank affidavit form
- 18 that contains a seal or other security device to prevent
- 19 reproduction of the form. The affidavit form shall contain a
- 20 statement indicating that the person or, if a minor, the person's
- 21 parent, managing conservator, or guardian understands the benefits
- 22 and risks of immunizations and the benefits and risks of not being
- 23 immunized.
- (e) The department may [shall] maintain a record of the

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- 1 total number of times an affidavit form was accessed on the
- 2 department's Internet website or requested under Subsection (c)
- 3 [forms sent out each year and shall report that information to the
- 4 legislature each year]. The department may not maintain a record of
- 5 the names of individuals who <u>download</u>, <u>access</u>, request, or <u>submit</u>
- 6 an affidavit form under this section.
- 7 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 8 of this Act, the Department of State Health Services shall modify
- 9 the existing affidavit form required by Section 161.0041, Health
- 10 and Safety Code, as amended by this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022
- 12 school year.
- 13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
