1-17 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
 1-18 AN ACT

1-19 relating to the purchase of cybersecurity insurance coverage by the
 1-20 Texas Department of Transportation.

1-21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 SECTION 1. Subchapter I, Chapter 201, Transportation Code,
 1-23 is amended by adding Section 201.712 to read as follows:

1-24 Sec. 201.712. PURCHASE OF CYBERSECURITY INSURANCE. (a) In
 1-25 this section, "cyber attack" means an attempt to gain illegal
 1-26 access to a computer or computer system for the purpose of causing
 1-27 damage, harm, or disruption.

1-28 (b) The department may purchase insurance coverage that the
 1-29 department considers necessary to protect against liability,
 1-30 revenue, and property losses that may result from a data breach or
 1-31 cyber attack.

1-32 (c) Insurance purchased under this section may include
 1-33 coverage for business and dependent business interruption loss,
 1-34 breach response, data recovery, cyber extortion or ransomware
 1-35 response, fiduciary liability, media liability, professional
 1-36 liability, or expenses for general incident management, such as
 1-37 investigation, remediation, and notification.

1-38 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
 1-39 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
 1-40 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 1-41 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 1-42 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
