4	SECTION 1. Section 28.002, Education Code, is amended by
5	adding Subsections $(h-2)$, $(h-3)$, and $(h-4)$ to read as follows:
6	(h-2) In adopting the essential knowledge and skills for the
7	social studies curriculum, the State Board of Education shall adop
8	essential knowledge and skills that develop each student's civi
9	knowledge, including an understanding of:
10	(1) the fundamental moral, political, and
11	intellectual foundations of the American experiment is

13	(2) the history, qualities, traditions, and feature
14	of civic engagement in the United States;
15	(3) the structure, function, and processes of

1 Democracy in America; 2 (E) the transcript of the first Lincoln-Douglas 3 debate; and 4 (F) the writings of the founding fathers of the 5 United States. 6 (h-3) For courses in the social studies curriculum in Texas history, United States history, world history, government, civics, 7 8 social studies, or other similar subjects: (1) a teacher may not be compelled to discuss current 9 10 events or widely debated and currently controversial issues of 11 public policy or social affairs; 12 (2) a teacher who chooses to discuss topics described by Subdivision (1) shall, to the best of the teacher's ability, 13 strive to explore those topics from diverse and contending 14 15 perspectives without giving deference to any one perspective; 16 (3) a school district, open-enrollment charter 17 school, or teacher may not require, make part of a course, or award a grade or course credit, including extra credit, for a student's: 18 (A) work for, affiliation with, or service 19 learning in association with any organization engaged in: 20 21 (i) lobbying for legislation at the federal, state, or local level; or 22 23 (ii) social or public policy advocacy; 24 (B) political activism, lobbying, or efforts to persuade members of the legislative or executive branch at the 25 26 federal, state, or local level to take specific actions by direct 27 communication; or

- 10 SECTION 2. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of

- 13 (b) Section 28.002(h-2), Education Code, as added by this
- 14 Act, applies beginning with the 2022-2023 school year.
- SECTION 3. Not later than December 31, 2022, the State Board
- 16 of Education shall review and revise, as needed, the essential
- 17 knowledge and skills of the social studies curriculum as required
- 18 by Section 28.002(h-2), Education Code, as added by this Act.
- 19 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
