6	(2) "Sex offender treatment provider" has the meaning

8	SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
9	to conduct that occurs on or after September 1, 2021. Conduct that
10	occurred before September 1, 2021, is governed by the law in effect
11	on the date the conduct occurred, and the former law is continued in
12	effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section, conduct
13	occurred before September 1, 2021, if any element of the conduct
14	occurred before that date.

15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
