CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, All who shared in the life of Sam L. Womack of Tyler
2 were deeply saddened by his death on March 4, 2020, at the age of 89;
3 and

4 WHEREAS, Sam Womack was born on September 13, 1930, to
5 Hildred and Minnie James Womack, and he grew up with the
6 companionship of his two siblings, Loraine and David; he graduated
7 from New London High School and went on to study at Tyler Junior
8 College; answering his nation's call to duty, he served in the U.S.
9 Army as a sergeant first class during the Korean War, and he
10 continued his service as a member of the Army Reserve until he was
11 honorably discharged in 1956; and

12 WHEREAS, Upon returning to civilian life, Mr. Womack was an
13 oil field worker for several years before becoming a game warden for
14 the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, where he enjoyed a
15 rewarding career that spanned more than three decades; and

16 WHEREAS, In all his endeavors, Mr. Womack benefited from the
17 love and support of his wife, Annelle, with whom he shared a
18 fulfilling union of 66 years; he took great pride in his son, Jason,
19 and with the passing years, he had the pleasure of seeing his family
20 grow to include two grandchildren, Bethany and Nicole, and two
21 great-grandchildren, Allie Nicole and Tommy John; and

22 WHEREAS, A proud veteran, a devoted father, and a loving
23 husband, Sam Womack lived a life rich in the intangibles that matter
24 most, and he will forever hold a treasured place in the hearts of

1 all those who held him dear; now, therefore, be it

3 hereby pay tribute to the memory of Sam L. Womack and extend sincere
