2 passing of Ramiro Robles of El Paso on December 9, 2018, at the age
3 of 85; and

4 WHEREAS, The son of Jose Robles and Dolores Gonzalez Robles,
5 Ramiro Robles was born on January 7, 1933, and grew up with three
6 brothers, Carlos, Jose, and Eduardo, and a sister, Bertha; he
7 attended Bowie High School in El Paso and went on to join the U.S.
8 Air Force, serving his country during the Korean War; after leaving
9 the military, he embarked on a successful career as a civilian
10 employee with the transportation department at Fort Bliss; and

11 WHEREAS, Valuing family above all else, Mr. Robles shared 64
12 years of marriage with his wife, Belen Borrego Robles, and he took
13 great pride in his children, Mary Helen, Carlos Francisco, and
14 Ramiro; with the passing years, he had the pleasure of seeing his
15 family grow to include 7 grandchildren and 11 great-grandchildren;

17 WHEREAS, This esteemed civic leader was a longtime member of
18 the League of United Latin American Citizens, serving as national
19 vice president for the Southwest for two terms and helping LULAC
20 Councils No. 132 and No. 298 with educational and youth programs; a
21 sports enthusiast, he loved following the New York Yankees and
22 Dallas Cowboys, and he enjoyed traveling and playing golf; and

23 WHEREAS, Although Ramiro Robles is greatly missed, he has
24 left his family and friends with many cherished memories, and he
