R E S O L U T I O N

1           WHEREAS, Since the beginning of the COVID-19 outbreak, the  
2 San Elizario Independent School District Board of Trustees has  
3 worked tirelessly to foster a suitable learning environment and  
4 ensure the health and well-being of area students; and

5           WHEREAS, The alarming scale of the pandemic has forced the  
6 school district to adapt to rapidly changing circumstances over the  
7 past year, including the closure of campuses, the introduction of  
8 remote learning, and the implementation of safety protocols upon  
9 reopening; tasked with setting policy and overseeing the operation  
10 of school facilities, the San Elizario ISD school board has  
11 carefully considered public health guidelines while working with  
12 administrators, educators, and parents to determine the most  
13 efficient way for students to return to class; and
