RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Residents of Fort Worth lost a distinguished
community leader with the death of former city councilperson Clyde
Wendell Picht on January 1, 2021, at the age of 87; and

WHEREAS, Born in Salt Lake City, Clyde Picht earned a 4 5 bachelor's degree in forest management from Utah State University, where he was also a member of the ROTC; after working for the U.S. 6 7 Forest Service as a firefighter and manager, he joined the U.S. Air Force and served for 22 years, including a combat tour as a pilot in 8 9 Vietnam, where he earned the Distinguished Flying Cross with two oak leaf clusters and the Purple Heart with two oak leaf clusters; 10 11 he rose to the rank of lieutenant colonel before retiring in 1978; 12 returning to civilian life, he trained flight crews for American Airlines for nearly two decades, including the crew of Air Force 13 14 One; he retired in 1996; and

WHEREAS, In 1997, Mr. Picht was elected to the Fort Worth 15 City Council by only 10 votes, earning the ironic nickname 16 "Landslide Clyde"; he served until 2005, winning the respect and 17 admiration of his constituents and his colleagues for his 18 dedication and thorough attention to detail; he ensured that every 19 constituent call or letter was attended to, and he read massive city 20 21 council binders straight through on the weekend before council 22 meetings; and

WHEREAS, Earlier in his life, Mr. Picht served as president,
vice president, and treasurer of the Wedgwood East Neighborhood

Association, and in retirement, he volunteered with the Salvation
Army Adult Rehabilitation Center, the B-36 Peacemaker Museum, the
Texas National Cemetery Foundation, and Friends of Texas Health
Harris Methodist Hospital Southwest; and

5 WHEREAS, In 1955, while still an ROTC student at Utah State University, he went into the hospital for minor surgery and met a 6 nurse named Emeline Trujillo, and he claimed to be in more pain than 7 8 he actually was so that she would spend more time with him; they married six months later and went on to share 65 years together 9 10 until her death in 2020; they were the parents of four children and later welcomed three grandchildren into their family; all their 11 12 lives, she called him by his middle name, Wendell, and he called her Tru, for her maiden name, Trujillo; and 13

14 WHEREAS, A dynamic man with a keen intellect, Clyde Picht 15 lived a rich and purposeful life devoted to his family, his 16 community, and his nation, and he leaves behind a record of service 17 that his loved ones can remember with pride; now, therefore, be it

18 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 87th Texas 19 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the memory of Clyde Wendell Picht 20 and extend heartfelt sympathy to his relatives and many friends; 21 and, be it further
