15 countless students through the knowledge and expertise he has
16 shared, as well as through his generosity and encouragement; and

17 WHEREAS, In all his endeavors, Mr. Lampe enjoys the love and
18 support of his wife of more than 45 years, Carolyn; with his
19 upcoming retirement, he looks forward to having the opportunity to
20 travel more; and

21 WHEREAS, Jack Lampe has touched the lives of many people
22 throughout his long career as an educator, and his contributions to
23 Southwest Texas Junior College will be remembered and appreciated
24 for years to come; now, therefore, be it
