2	relating to an election to approve a reduction or reallocation of
3	funding or resources for a municipal or county law enforcement

5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 4, Local Government Code, is
7	amended by adding Chapter 135 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 135. ELECTION FOR REDUCTION OF FUNDING OR RESOURCES FOR LAW
9	ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES
10	Sec. 135.001. ELECTION REQUIRED. (a) A municipality or
11	county shall hold an election in accordance with this chapter if the
12	municipality or county proposes to adopt a budget for a fiscal year
13	that, compared to the budget adopted by the municipality or county
14	for the preceding fiscal year:
15	(1) reduces for a law enforcement agency:
16	(A) the appropriation to the agency as a
17	percentage of the total budget;
18	(B) the number of peace officers the agency is
19	authorized to employ per 1,000 municipal or county residents, as
20	applicable;
21	(C) the total amount of funding per peace officer
22	for peace officer overtime compensation; or
23	(D) the amount of funding per peace officer for
24	the recruitment and training of new peace officers to fill vacant

- 1 and new peace officer positions in the department; or 2 (2) reallocates funding or resources from one law 3 enforcement agency to another. 4 (b) A municipality or county may not adopt a budget with a proposed reduction or reallocation described by Subsection (a) 5 until the municipality or county receives voter approval for the 6 7 proposed reduction or reallocation at an election held for that 8 purpose. 9 Sec. 135.002. BALLOT PROPOSITION REQUIREMENTS. 10 municipality or county holding an election under this chapter shall ensure that the ballot proposition for the election includes, as 11 12 applicable: 13 (1) a detailed explanation of each proposed reduction; 14 (2) the amount of each proposed reduction; 15 (3) the recipient of reallocated funding or resources; (4) the impact on the local tax rate, if any; and 16 17 (5) the expected length of time that the proposed reduction or reallocation will remain in effect. 18
- Sec. 135.003. USE OF PUBLIC MONEY FOR CAMPAIGN PROHIBITED.

 A municipality or county holding an election under this chapter may

 not use public money on informational campaigns or advocacy related

 to the proposed reduction or reallocation.
- Sec. 135.004. COMPLAINT. A person who believes that a municipality or county has violated this chapter may file a complaint with the criminal justice division of the office of the governor.
- Sec. 135.005. COMPTROLLER INVESTIGATION AND WITHHOLDING OF

- 1 CERTAIN MONEY. (a) On request by the criminal justice division of
- 2 the office of the governor, the comptroller shall determine whether
- 3 a municipality or county has violated this chapter. The comptroller
- 4 shall issue a written determination to the governor, lieutenant
- 5 governor, and speaker of the house of representatives.
- 6 (b) Notwithstanding any other law, if the comptroller
- 7 determines that a municipality or county violated this chapter, the
- 8 municipality or county may not adopt a tax rate for the subsequent
- 9 municipal or county fiscal year that exceeds the municipality's or
- 10 county's tax rate on the date of the violation.
- 11 (c) A tax rate limitation described by Subsection (b)
- 12 becomes inapplicable on the earlier of:
- 13 <u>(1) the date the comptroller issues a written</u>
- 14 determination that the municipality or county has, as applicable:
- 15 (A) adopted a budget that reverses all funding
- 16 reductions, adjusted for inflation, and personnel reductions in
- 17 <u>violation of this chapter; or</u>
- 18 <u>(B) restored reallocated funding or resources to</u>
- 19 the original law enforcement agency; or
- 20 (2) the date the municipality or county receives voter
- 21 approval for the reduction or reallocation that violated this
- 22 <u>chapter in an election held in accordance with this chapter.</u>
- 23 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
