A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the offense of hazing.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 37.152(a), Education Code, is amended as
5	follows:
6	(a) A person commits an offense if the person:

- 7 (1) engages in hazing;
- solicits, encourages, directs, aids, or attempts 8 to aid another in engaging in hazing;
- (3) recklessly permits hazing to occur; or 10
- (4) has firsthand knowledge of the planning of a 11 12 specific hazing incident involving a student in an educational institution, or has firsthand knowledge that a specific hazing 13 14 incident has occurred, and knowingly fails to report that knowledge [in writing] to the dean of students, [or] another appropriate 15 official of the institution, a peace officer, or a law enforcement 16 17 agency.
- SECTION 2. Section 37.155(b), Education Code, is amended to 18 read as follows: 19
- (b) Any person, including an entity organized to support a 20 student group at an educational institution, who voluntarily 21 reports a specific hazing incident involving a student in an 22 educational institution to the dean of students, [or] another 23 appropriate official of the institution, a peace officer, or a law 24

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- 1 <u>enforcement agency</u> is immune from civil or criminal liability that
- 2 might otherwise be incurred or imposed as a result of the reported
- 3 hazing incident if the person:
- 4 (1) reports the incident before being contacted by the
- 5 institution concerning the incident or otherwise being included in
- 6 the institution's investigation of the incident; and
- 7 (2) as determined by the dean of students or other
- 8 appropriate official of the institution designated by the
- 9 institution, cooperates in good faith throughout any institutional
- 10 process regarding the incident.
- 11 SECTION 3. Section 37.157, Education Code, is amended to
- 12 read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 37.157. REPORTING BY MEDICAL AUTHORITIES. A doctor or
- 14 other medical practitioner who treats a student who may have been
- 15 subjected to hazing activities:
- 16 (1) $\frac{\text{shall}}{\text{shall}}$ [may] report the suspected hazing activities
- 17 to police or other law enforcement officials; and
- 18 (2) is immune from civil or other liability that might
- 19 otherwise be imposed or incurred as a result of the report, unless
- 20 the report is made in bad faith or with malice.
- 21 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 22 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 23 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 24 governed by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and
- 25 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes
- 26 of this section, an offense was committed before the effective date
- 27 of this Act if any element of the offense was committed before that

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- 1 date.
- 2 SECTION 5. Section 37.155, Education Code, as amended by
- 3 this Act, applies only to a civil cause of action that accrues on or
- 4 after the effective date of this Act. An action that accrued before
- 5 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect at
- 6 the time the action accrued, and that law is continued in effect for
- 7 that purpose.
- 8 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
