## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

	AN ACT

- 2 relating to licensing requirements to operate an end stage renal
- 3 disease facility and the provision of home dialysis care by a
- 4 dialysis technician.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 251.012, Health and Safety Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 251.012. EXEMPTIONS FROM LICENSING REQUIREMENT. The
- 9 following facilities are not required to be licensed under this
- 10 chapter:
- 11 (1) a home and community support services agency that
- 12 <u>is</u> licensed under Chapter 142 with a home dialysis designation <u>and</u>
- 13 <u>that:</u>
- 14 (A) has not more than five patients at any time as
- 15 a total number of patients to whom the agency provides dialysis
- 16 services; or
- 17 (B) is certified by the Centers for Medicare and
- 18 Medicaid Services as an end stage renal disease facility under
- 19 Medicare;
- 20 (2) a hospital licensed under Chapter 241 that
- 21 provides dialysis only to individuals receiving:
- 22 (A) inpatient services from the hospital; or
- 23 (B) outpatient services due to a disaster
- 24 declared by the governor or a federal disaster declared by the

- 1 president of the United States occurring in this state or another
- 2 state during the term of the disaster declaration;
- 3 (3) a hospital operated by or on behalf of the state as
- 4 part of the managed health care provider network established under
- 5 Chapter 501, Government Code, that provides dialysis only to
- 6 individuals receiving:
- 7 (A) inpatient services from the hospital; or
- 8 (B) outpatient services while serving a term of
- 9 confinement in a facility operated by or under contract with the
- 10 Texas Department of Criminal Justice;
- 11 (4) an end stage renal disease facility operated by or
- 12 on behalf of the state as part of the managed health care provider
- 13 network established under Chapter 501, Government Code, that
- 14 provides dialysis only to individuals receiving those services
- 15 while serving a term of confinement in a facility operated by or
- 16 under contract with the Texas Department of Criminal Justice; or
- 17 (5) the office of a physician, other than an [unless
- 18 the] office [is] used primarily as an end stage renal disease
- 19 facility, that:
- 20 (A) has not more than five patients at any time as
- 21 <u>a total number of patients to whom the office provides dialysis</u>
- 22 services; or
- 23 (B) is certified by the Centers for Medicare and
- 24 Medicaid Services as an end stage renal disease facility under
- 25 Medicare.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 251, Health and Safety
- 27 Code, is amended by adding Section 251.033 to read as follows:

- 1 Sec. 251.033. PROVISION OF HOME DIALYSIS CARE IN NURSING
- 2 FACILITIES. (a) A dialysis technician may provide home dialysis
- 3 care in a nursing facility, including hemodialysis, only if:
- 4 (1) the care is provided under the personal
- 5 supervision of a registered nurse who is:
- 6 (A) in compliance with all commission rules
- 7 regarding training and competency for registered nurses to provide
- 8 care at end stage renal disease facilities; and
- 9 (B) employed by the same entity that employs the
- 10 dialysis technician; and
- 11 (2) the dialysis technician has complied with all
- 12 commission rules regarding training and competency for dialysis
- 13 technicians.
- 14 (b) For purposes of this section, "personal supervision"
- 15 means supervision of a dialysis technician by a registered nurse
- 16 who is physically present in the room during the administration of
- 17 dialysis services by the dialysis technician.
- SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 19 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 20 Services Commission shall adopt rules necessary to implement
- 21 Section 251.033, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.
- 22 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
