4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 254, Health and Safety
6	Code, is amended by adding Section 254.1555 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 254.1555. CERTAIN FEES PROHIBITED. (a) A facility
8	that provides a health care service, including testing or
9	vaccination, to an individual accessing the service from the
10	individual's vehicle may not charge the individual or a third-party
11	payor a facility or observation fee.
12	(b) This section may not be construed as expanding the type
13	of health care services a facility is authorized to provide under
14	this chapter.
15	SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 254, Health and Safety
16	Code, is amended by adding Section 254.160 to read as follows:
17	Sec. 254.160. PROHIBITED PRICING PRACTICES DURING DECLARED
18	STATE OF DISASTER. (a) In this section, "unconscionable price"
19	means a price a facility charges for a health care service provided
20	to an individual in an amount that is more than 200 percent of the
21	average price charged for the same or a substantially similar
22	product or service provided to other individuals by health care
23	facilities located in the same county or nearest county to the
24	county in which the freestanding emergency medical care facility is

- 1 located, as applicable, according to data collected by the
- 2 <u>department under Chapter 108.</u>
- 3 (b) A facility, during a state of disaster declared under
- 4 Chapter 418, Government Code, may not:
- 5 (1) charge an individual an unconscionable price for a
- 6 product or service provided at the facility; or
- 7 (2) knowingly or intentionally charge a third-party
- 8 payor, including a health benefit plan insurer, a price higher than
- 9 the price charged to an individual for the same product or service
- 10 based on the payor's liability for payment or partial payment of the
- 11 product or service.
- SECTION 3. Subchapter E, Chapter 254, Health and Safety
- 13 Code, is amended by adding Section 254.207 to read as follows:
- Sec. 254.207. MANDATORY ENFORCEMENT. Notwithstanding any
- 15 conflicting provision in this subchapter and except for good cause
- 16 shown, the Health and Human Services Commission shall impose the
- 17 following on a person licensed under this chapter who violates
- 18 Section 254.160 or a rule adopted under that section:
- 19 (1) for the first violation, an administrative penalty
- 20 in an amount equal to \$10,000;
- 21 (2) for the second violation:
- (A) an administrative penalty in an amount equal
- 23 to \$50,000; and
- (B) a suspension of the person's license for 30
- 25 days; and
- 26 (3) for the third violation, a permanent revocation of
- 27 the person's license.

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1 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
