Dutton, Jr., in 2012 and rose to become chief of staff; she continued her education as well, earning her law degree magna cum laude from Texas Southern University in 2018; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Jones demonstrated exceptional skill and dedication as a committee clerk during multiple sessions, furthering the work of the House Committees on Urban Affairs, Public Education, and Juvenile Justice and Family Issues; a stalwart champion of education and literacy, she brought her characteristic enthusiasm and persistence to bear in supporting legislation to improve reading scores and effect meaningful change in other key areas; moreover, she was committed to addressing racial disparities in education outcomes and ensuring fairness in rules for charter schools; in tribute to her exceptional efforts, the TSU Thurgood Marshall School of Law is establishing a scholarship in her honor; and

WHEREAS, Known to many as "T," Ms. Jones was a caring mentor to numerous staff members, and she generously shared her
