- 2 relating to the licensing of child-care facilities providing care
- 3 to certain unaccompanied children and the suspension of laws
- 4 relating to the licensing of those facilities; creating a criminal

- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 418.016, Government Code, is amended by
- 8 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (i) to read as
- 9 follows:
- 10 (a) Except as provided by this section, the [The] governor
- 11 may suspend the provisions of any regulatory statute prescribing
- 12 the procedures for conduct of state business or the orders or rules
- 13 of a state agency if strict compliance with the provisions, orders,
- 14 or rules would in any way prevent, hinder, or delay necessary action
- 15 in coping with a disaster.
- (i) The governor may not suspend a provision of Chapter 42,
- 17 Human Resources Code, or any other law or rule relating to the
- 18 licensing or regulation of a residential child-care facility.
- 19 SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 42, Human Resources Code,
- 20 is amended by adding Section 42.0762 to read as follows:
- Sec. 42.0762. CARE OF CERTAIN UNACCOMPANIED CHILDREN;
- 22 CRIMINAL PENALTY. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), a
- 23 person who provides 24-hour care under a contract with United
- 24 States Immigration and Customs Enforcement or the Office of Refugee

- 1 Resettlement to children who are not accompanied by or in the
- 2 physical custody of a parent, guardian, or other adult family
- 3 member must be licensed or certified under this chapter as a
- 4 residential child-care facility.
- 5 (b) This section does not apply to a religious institution
- 6 that is exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(a),
- 7 Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as an organization described by
- 8 Section 501(c)(3) of that code.
- 9 (c) A person who violates this section commits an offense.
- 10 (d) An offense under this section is a state jail felony.
- 11 SECTION 3. On the effective date of this Act, any law or
- 12 rule relating to licensing or regulating residential child-care
- 13 facilities that is suspended under Chapter 418, Government Code, as
- 14 that law existed immediately before the effective date of this Act,
- 15 is reinstated.
- 16 SECTION 4. The Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 17 establish a process to issue or renew the license of a residential
- 18 child-care facility whose license was revoked, suspended, not
- 19 renewed, or otherwise affected by an order of the governor issued
- 20 under the authority of Section 418.016, Government Code.
- 21 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 26 legislative session.
