R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, A life made rich through meaningful service drew to
2 a close with the passing of U.S. Army Command Sergeant Major (Ret.)
3 Lloyd Coley of Belton on August 28, 2023, at the age of 69; and

4 WHEREAS, The son of William E. Coley Sr. and Laura Lee Coley,
5 Lloyd Coley was born in Richmond, Virginia, on June 19, 1954; he
6 grew up with the companionship of eight siblings, Barbara, Essie,
7 William, Spencer, Sylvia, Gwendolyn, Sheila, and Lavette; and

8 WHEREAS, Mr. Coley enlisted in the United States Army in July
9 1972, and his distinguished military career ultimately spanned
10 three decades; he rose to the rank of command sergeant major and was
11 awarded the Legion of Merit in recognition of his exemplary service
12 to his nation; and

13 WHEREAS, In all his endeavors, Mr. Coley enjoyed the love and
14 support of his wife, Brenda, with whom he shared a rewarding
15 marriage of 47 years; he was the devoted father of two children,
16 Ebonie and Justin, and he also experienced the joy of welcoming two
17 grandchildren into his family; a man of faith who was guided by a
18 strong moral compass, he attended Cornerstone Baptist Church, where
19 he was ordained as a deacon and was unanimously selected to serve as
20 deacon chairman; and

22 his integrity, his strength of character, and his devotion to his
23 family and his country remain to comfort and inspire those he leaves
