

R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, CommonCents Credit Union celebrated the
2 groundbreaking of its new building in Winnie on October 10, 2023;
3 and

4 WHEREAS, Originally known as Goodyear Federal Credit Union,
5 this financial institution was first chartered on August 20, 1963,
6 in an office at the Goodyear Beaumont Chemical Plant; the credit
7 union soon moved to an adjacent parcel of land donated by the plant,
8 and that location continues to serve as its main office; it became
9 community chartered in 2004, and it took on its current name,
10 CommonCents Credit Union, in 2016; and

11 WHEREAS, Over the years, the credit union has expanded its
12 reach, opening a branch in Winnie and a second location in Beaumont,
13 and it provides members with 24/7 access to their accounts through
14 online banking, an automated response teller, and a mobile banking
15 app; today, CommonCents Credit Union serves more than 3,000 members
16 and has over \$32 million in assets; and

17 WHEREAS, The new facility will replace the existing Winnie
18 location, which has been housed in a modular building since it
19 opened in 2009; the updated space will allow the credit union to
20 better serve its customers in Chambers County; and

21 WHEREAS, For six decades, CommonCents Credit Union has
22 provided jobs and valuable services to the region, and it is indeed
23 deserving of recognition at this time; now, therefore, be it
