RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, A full and productive life drew to a close with the 2 passing of admired attorney and civic leader James Reed Lovell of 3 Amarillo on July 4, 2023, at the age of 96; and

WHEREAS, The oldest son of Benjamin Reed Lovell and Reta 4 5 Eudora Poovey Lovell, Jim Lovell was delivered at home in Ashtola on April 8, 1927, with the help of his grandmother, Johnnie Mae 6 Blackburn Poovey, the local midwife; he grew up with the loving 7 guidance of his parents and both his maternal and paternal 8 9 grandparents; along with his brother, Joe Thomas, he worked and played at the Lovells' combination service station, grist mill, 10 11 country store, and post office; he graduated as president of 12 Clarendon High School's Class of 1944 and enlisted in the U.S. Navy at the end of World War II; following basic training in San Diego, 13 14 he served on shore patrol in the Philippines; his duties included guarding men under court-martial, and his observations of military 15 16 lawyers inspired his career choice following his honorable discharge in 1946; and 17

WHEREAS, The G.I. Bill enabled Mr. Lovell to become a first-generation college student; he attended Clarendon Junior College and Southern Methodist University, where he earned both his bachelor's degree in business administration and his law degree; after establishing a solo law practice in Dumas, he formed a partnership with Hugh T. Lyle in 1953; although Mr. Lyle died in 1976, Mr. Lovell continued to call the firm Lovell & Lyle in honor

1 of his partner until 2016, when he moved to Amarillo to be closer to 2 family and medical care; he became of counsel to the firm of his 3 sons before fading eyesight obliged him to conclude his remarkable 4 69-year career; and

5 WHEREAS, Devoted to his profession, Mr. Lovell was a mentor to many and held membership with numerous local, state, and 6 national associations; he was a director of the State Bar of Texas 7 for many years and served as chair of the State Bar of Texas 8 Insurance Trust; among other accolades, he received the 1979 9 10 President's Award and special recognition for his leadership in the founding and continued operation of the Texas Lawyers' Insurance 11 12 Exchange; in order to launch the TLIE, he signed a personal bank loan for \$165,000, and he served as president and chair of the board 13 14 for three decades; and

15 WHEREAS, Mr. Lovell was also an investor and developer of 16 farm and ranch land in the 1970s; initially enjoying considerable 17 success, he showed great tenacity, courage, and diligence as he 18 weathered the crushing interest rates and deflation of agricultural 19 land values in the 1980s; and

WHEREAS, Dedicated to Dumas and Moore Counties, Mr. Lovell 20 was highly engaged in civic life; for over 25 years, he was Dumas 21 city attorney, and he served other North Plains towns in this role 22 as well; he was a bank director in Dumas and Sunray, and he 23 24 completed multiple terms as a trustee of the Dumas Independent School District; in 1975, he was appointed to the West Texas State 25 26 University Board of Regents, and he held the office of chair in 1978; he led the Dumas Chamber of Commerce, the Moore County 27

1 Development Corporation, and similar groups for many years and 2 spearheaded efforts to bring American Beef to the Schroeter 3 Industrial Park at Cactus; in addition, he was very active in local 4 politics; a man of deep faith, he was a valued member of First 5 Presbyterian Church of Dumas for seven decades and served as an 6 elder; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Lovell married his high school sweetheart, the 7 former Louva Hunt, in 1951, and they were blessed with eight 8 children, Lynnita, John, Jimmy, Joe, Jeff, Laura, Leslie, and 9 10 Jesse; he instilled in them good manners, a strong work ethic, and a sense of responsibility while also encouraging them to find their 11 12 own paths; during summers, the Lovells broadened the horizons of their offspring on road trips to 48 states, including Alaska; that 13 14 first marriage ended with three children still at home, and 15 Mr. Lovell saw to their upbringing; he sent all of his sons and daughters through college; and 16

17 WHEREAS, Fortunate to find love a second time, Mr. Lovell met Betty King through a friend and dancing class, and they wed on 18 19 December 28, 1991; the couple traveled extensively and enjoyed spending time at the cabin they built on the Cimarron River in Ute 20 21 Park, New Mexico; they shared a fulfilling relationship until her passing in 2014; in his later years, Mr. Lovell was surrounded by 22 23 the love of a fine family that grew to include many grandchildren 24 and great-grandchildren, as well as three stepdaughters and their extended families; and 25

26 WHEREAS, Jim Lovell was an engaged citizen, a devoted family 27 man, and an admired member of the legal profession, and his

1 wide-ranging contributions will remain a lasting source of 2 inspiration to all who were fortunate enough to know him; now, 3 therefore, be it
