A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to an appropriation for border security.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION TO TRUSTEED PROGRAMS WITHIN THE
- 5 OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR. (a) The amount of \$1,540,000,000 is
- 6 appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Trusteed Programs
- 7 within the Office of the Governor for use during the two-year period
- 8 beginning on the effective date of this Act for the purpose of
- 9 providing funding for border security operations and the
- 10 construction, operation, and maintenance of border barrier
- 11 infrastructure.
- 12 (b) Of the amount appropriated by Subsection (a) of this
- 13 section, the Trusteed Programs within the Office of the Governor
- 14 shall transfer \$40,000,000 to the Department of Public Safety for
- 15 border security operations, including paying for additional
- 16 overtime expenses and costs due to an increased law enforcement
- 17 presence to preserve public safety and security in the Colony Ridge
- 18 development in Liberty County, Texas.
- 19 SECTION 2. PROHIBITIONS ON USE OF APPROPRIATED MONEY. The
- 20 money appropriated by this Act may not be used to:
- 21 (1) acquire property through the exercise of eminent
- 22 domain;
- 23 (2) build a barrier along this state's international
- 24 border with Mexico on property acquired through the exercise of

- 1 eminent domain;
- 2 (3) acquire property for a barrier that abuts the
- 3 boundary between this state and another state; or
- 4 (4) build a barrier that abuts the boundary between
- 5 this state and another state.
- 6 SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 7 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 8 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 9 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 10 immediate effect, this Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 11 last day of the legislative session.
