WHEREAS, Beginning at the City Hall Plaza in downtown Dallas, the parade will feature speeches and appearances by dignitaries and military leaders and include the traditional Eleventh Hour Ceremony, a symbolic wreath laying, the playing of taps, and a military flyover in the missing man formation; moreover, individuals representing the branches of the U.S. armed forces will take the oath of enlistment; and

WHEREAS, Americans owe a profound debt of gratitude to the men and women who have put their lives on the line in defense of our safety and freedom, and the Greater Dallas Veterans Day Parade is a fitting tribute to their sacrifice and dedication to duty; now, therefore, be it
