RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Brad Jones, the former president and CEO of the 2 Electric Reliability Council of Texas and an influential figure in 3 the state's energy industry, passed away on November 8, 2023, at the 4 age of 60; and

5 WHEREAS, Born on November 26, 1962, Bradley Carl Jones graduated with a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering from 6 7 Texas Tech University and earned his master's degree in business administration from The University of Texas at Arlington; his 8 9 exceptional career in the energy sector spanned more than 30 years and included a notable tenure at Luminant, where he held such roles 10 as vice president of generation development and vice president of 11 12 government relations; in recognition of his leadership efforts with the company, he was honored with a Commissioners' Award from the 13 14 Public Utility Commission of Texas; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Jones went on to join the executive team at the Electric Reliability Council of Texas, serving as senior vice president and chief operating officer from 2013 to 2015; his achievements with ERCOT led to his appointment as president and CEO of the New York Independent System Operator in 2015, and he guided that organization until retiring in 2018; and

21 WHEREAS, In May 2021, Mr. Jones agreed to return to ERCOT to 22 serve as interim president and CEO; in that role, he rose to the 23 challenge of leading the council in the aftermath of Winter Storm 24 Uri, which significantly impacted the state's energy

1 infrastructure; he concluded his interim responsibilities with
2 ERCOT on November 1, 2022; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Jones served on the board of directors of both 3 ERCOT and NYISO and also held membership in the Gulf Coast Power 4 5 Association and the FutureGen Industrial Alliance; active in a number of philanthropic initiatives, he was a board member for the 6 March of Dimes, Atlas Scholars, and the St. Peter's Health 7 8 Foundation; to honor his legacy, the Brad Jones Engineering Scholarship has been established at his undergraduate alma mater, 9 10 Texas Tech University; and

11 WHEREAS, Although the passing of Brad Jones is a profound 12 loss to all who were privileged to know him, his dedicated work 13 greatly influenced the energy industry in Texas and beyond, and his 14 contributions will continue to be remembered and admired for many 15 years to come; now, therefore, be it

16 RESOLVED, That the Senate of the 88th Texas Legislature, 4th 17 Called Session, hereby pay tribute to the life of Brad Jones and 18 extend heartfelt sympathy to his family, friends, and former 19 colleagues; and, be it further

20 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be 21 prepared for his family and that when the Texas Senate adjourns this 22 day, it do so in memory of Brad Jones.
