**WHEREAS**, The son of Eduardo and Josefa Lucio, "Jesse" Lucio was born in Brownsville on September 3, 1952; he grew up with nine siblings, Beatrice, Eddie, Bertie, Helen, Maggie, David, Bob, Joe, and Richard; and
