 1-22 AN ACT

1-23 relating to access to certain law enforcement, corrections, and
 1-24 prosecutorial records under the public information law.

1-25 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-26 SECTION 1. Section 552.108, Government Code, is amended by
 1-27 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:

1-28 (d) The exception to disclosure provided by Subsection
 1-29 (a)(2) does not apply to information, records, or notations if:

1-30 (1) a person who is described by or depicted in the
 1-31 information, record, or notation, other than a peace officer, is
 1-32 deceased or incapacitated; and

1-33 (2) each person who is described by or depicted in the
 1-34 information, record, or notation, other than a person who is
 1-35 deceased or incapacitated, consents to the release of the
 1-36 information, record, or notation.

1-37 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
 1-38 to a request for public information received by a governmental body
 1-39 or an officer for public information on or after the effective date
 1-40 of this Act.

1-41 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
