A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the membership of a public school's threat assessment
- 3 and safe and supportive school team and committee and the
- 4 permissible uses of the school safety allotment under the public
- 5 school finance system.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Sections 37.115(d) and (e), Education Code, are
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 (d) The superintendent of the district shall ensure, to the
- 10 greatest extent practicable, that the members appointed to each
- 11 team have expertise in counseling, behavior management, mental
- 12 health and substance use, classroom instruction, special
- 13 education, school administration, school safety and security, and
- 14 emergency management[, and law enforcement]. A team may serve more
- 15 than one campus of a school district, provided that each district
- 16 campus is assigned a team.
- 17 (e) The superintendent of a school district may establish a
- 18 committee, or assign to an existing committee established by the
- 19 district, the duty to oversee the operations of teams established
- 20 for the district. A committee with oversight responsibility under
- 21 this subsection must include members with expertise in human
- 22 resources, education, special education, counseling, behavior
- 23 management, school administration, mental health and substance
- 24 use, school safety and security, and emergency management[, and law

1 enforcement]. SECTION 2. Section 48.115(b), Education Code, is amended to 2 3 read as follows: 4 Funds allocated under this section must be used to 5 improve school safety and security, including costs associated 6 with: securing school facilities, including: 7 (1)8 improvements to school infrastructure; 9 (B) the use or installation of physical barriers; 10 and (C) the purchase and maintenance of: 11 12 (i) security cameras or other security equipment; and 13 (ii) technology, including communications 14 15 systems or devices, that facilitates communication and information sharing between students, school personnel, and first responders in 16 17 an emergency; [providing security for the district, including: (2) 18 [(A) employing school district peace officers, 19 private security officers, and school marshals; and 20 [(B) collaborating with local law enforcement 21 agencies, such as entering into a memorandum of understanding for 22 the assignment of school resource officers to schools in the 23 24 district; 25 $\left[\frac{(3)}{3}\right]$ school safety and security training and 26 planning, including: 27 (A) active shooter and emergency response

- 1 training;
- 2 (B) prevention and treatment programs relating
- 3 to addressing adverse childhood experiences; and
- 4 (C) the prevention, identification, and
- 5 management of emergencies and threats, using evidence-based,
- 6 effective prevention practices and including:
- 7 (i) providing licensed counselors, social
- 8 workers, <u>social-emotional learning coordinators</u>, and individuals
- 9 trained in restorative discipline and restorative justice
- 10 practices;
- 11 (ii) providing mental health personnel and
- 12 support;
- 13 (iii) providing behavioral health
- 14 services;
- 15 (iv) establishing threat reporting
- 16 systems; and
- 17 (v) developing and implementing programs
- 18 focused on <u>social-emotional learning</u>, restorative justice
- 19 practices, culturally relevant instruction, and providing mental
- 20 health support; and
- (3) (4) providing programs related to suicide
- 22 prevention, intervention, and postvention.
- 23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
