- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,
- 6 is amended by adding Section 32.02601 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 32.02601. CONTINUOUS ELIGIBILITY FOR PREGNANT AND
- 8 POSTPARTUM WOMEN. A woman who is eligible for all
- 9 pregnancy-related and postpartum benefits under the medical
- 10 assistance program for the 60-day period following the woman's
- 11 pregnancy shall remain continuously eligible for all benefits under
- 12 the medical assistance program for not less than 12 months.
- 13 SECTION 2. Section 32.024(1-1), Human Resources Code, is
- 14 repealed.
- 15 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 16 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 17 Services Commission shall, in accordance with Section 1902(e)(16),
- 18 Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. Section 1396a(e)(16)), seek from the
- 19 appropriate federal agency an amendment to the state's Medicaid
- 20 state plan to implement Section 32.02601, Human Resources Code, as
- 21 added by this Act. The commission may delay implementing this Act
- 22 until the state plan amendment is approved.
- 23 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

- 2 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 3 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
