L	AN ACT

- 2 relating to in-person visitation with hospital patients during
- 3 certain periods of disaster.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 241.012(c), (g), and (i), Health and
- 6 Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (c) Notwithstanding Subsection (b), a hospital may during a
- 8 qualifying period of disaster:
- 9 (1) restrict the number of visitors a patient
- 10 receiving care or treatment at the hospital may receive at any one
- 11 time to not fewer than one;
- 12 (2) require a visitor to the hospital to:
- 13 (A) complete a health screening before entering
- 14 the hospital; and
- 15 (B) wear personal protective equipment at all
- 16 times while visiting a patient at the hospital; and
- 17 (3) deny entry to or remove from the hospital's
- 18 premises a visitor who fails or refuses to:
- 19 (A) submit to or meet the requirements of a
- 20 health screening administered by the hospital; or
- 21 (B) wear personal protective equipment that
- 22 meets the hospital's infection control and safety requirements in
- 23 the manner prescribed by the hospital.
- 24 (g) A determination made by an attending physician under

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- 1 Subsection (f)(2) <u>must be in writing and</u> is valid for not more than
- $2 \quad \underline{48 \text{ hours}} \quad [\text{five days}] \quad \text{after} \quad [\text{the date}] \quad \text{the determination is made}$
- 3 unless renewed by an attending physician. A renewal of the
- 4 determination must be in writing, is valid for not more than 48
- 5 hours after the renewal is made, and may be renewed in the same
- 6 manner as the initial determination.
- 7 (i) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, a
- 8 hospital may not prohibit in-person visitation by a religious
- 9 counselor of the patient's choosing with a patient who is receiving
- 10 care or treatment at the hospital [and who is seriously ill or
- 11 dying for a reason other than the religious counselor's failure to
- 12 comply with a requirement described by Subsection (c)(2).
- 13 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
