- 11 that provides comprehensive medical rehabilitation services to
- 12 annually provide as a condition of continued licensure a minimum of
- eight hours of initial inservice training for new employees and 13
- 14 four hours of continuing inservice training for continuing
- employees that is designed to assist employees and health care 15
- 16 professionals associated with the facility in identifying patient
- abuse or neglect and illegal, unprofessional, or unethical conduct 17
- by or in the facility. 18
- (a-1) The training required under Subsection (a) may be 19
- provided: 20
- 21 (1) in person; or
- 22 (2) through a live, interactive, instructor-led, and
- 23 electronic method that uses synchronous audiovisual interaction
- between the instructor and employees. 24

SECTION 2. Section 161.133(a), Health and Safety Code, as amended by this Act, applies to the minimum number of inservice training hours provided as a condition of licensure by health care facilities subject to that section on and after the effective date of this Act. The minimum number of inservice training hours provided before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
