## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

Τ	AN ACT
2	relating to requiring public schools to use the wet bulb globe
3	temperature to determine whether conditions are unsatisfactory for
4	student outdoor activities due to severe heat.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 38, Education Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 38.025 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 38.025. USE OF WET BULB GLOBE TEMPERATURE FOR SEVERE
9	HEAT DETERMINATIONS. (a) In this section, "wet bulb globe
10	temperature" means a comprehensive measurement of environmental
11	conditions that accounts for ambient temperature, relative
12	humidity, wind, and solar radiation.
13	(b) Each school district and open-enrollment charter school
14	shall refer to the wet bulb globe temperature in determining
15	satisfactory or unsatisfactory conditions for outdoor activities,
16	including:
17	(1) athletic activities;
18	(2) recess;
19	(3) extracurricular activities conducted outdoors;
20	and
21	(4) any other related activities.
22	(c) This section does not:
23	(1) waive any immunity from liability of a school
24	district or open-enrollment charter school or of district or

- 1 charter school officers or employees; or
- 2 (2) create any liability for a cause of action against
- 3 <u>a school district or open-enrollment charter school or against</u>
- 4 <u>district or charter school officers or employees.</u>
- 5 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024
- 6 school year.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
