- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 27.010(a), Civil Practice and Remedies
- 7 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) This chapter does not apply to:
- 9 (1) an enforcement action that is brought in the name
- 10 of this state or a political subdivision of this state by the
- 11 attorney general, a district attorney, a criminal district
- 12 attorney, or a county attorney;
- 13 (2) a legal action brought against a person primarily
- 14 engaged in the business of selling or leasing goods or services, if
- 15 the statement or conduct arises out of the sale or lease of goods,
- 16 services, or an insurance product, insurance services, or a
- 17 commercial transaction in which the intended audience is an actual
- 18 or potential buyer or customer;
- 19 (3) a legal action seeking recovery for bodily injury,
- 20 wrongful death, or survival or to statements made regarding that
- 21 legal action;
- 22 (4) a legal action brought under the Insurance Code or
- 23 arising out of an insurance contract;
- 24 (5) a legal action arising from an officer-director,

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- 1 employee-employer, or independent contractor relationship that:
- 2 (A) seeks recovery for misappropriation of trade
- 3 secrets or corporate opportunities; or
- 4 (B) seeks to enforce a non-disparagement
- 5 agreement or a covenant not to compete;
- 6 (6) a legal action filed under Title 1, 2, 4, or 5,
- 7 Family Code, or an application for a protective order under
- 8 Subchapter A, Chapter 7B, Code of Criminal Procedure;
- 9 (7) a legal action brought under Chapter 17, Business
- 10 & Commerce Code, other than an action governed by Section 17.49(a)
- 11 of that chapter;
- 12 (8) a legal action in which a moving party raises a
- 13 defense pursuant to Section 160.010, Occupations Code, Section
- 14 161.033, Health and Safety Code, or the Health Care Quality
- 15 Improvement Act of 1986 (42 U.S.C. 11101 et seq.);
- 16 (9) an eviction suit brought under Chapter 24,
- 17 Property Code;
- 18 (10) a disciplinary action or disciplinary proceeding
- 19 brought under Chapter 81, Government Code, or the Texas Rules of
- 20 Disciplinary Procedure;
- 21 (11) a legal action brought under Chapter 554,
- 22 Government Code; [or]
- 23 (12) a legal action based on a common law fraud claim;
- 24 or
- 25 (13) a legal malpractice claim brought by a client or
- 26 former client.
- 27 SECTION 2. Section 27.010(a), Civil Practice and Remedies

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- 1 Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to an action commenced on
- 2 or after the effective date of this Act. An action commenced before
- 3 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law applicable to
- 4 the action immediately before the effective date of this Act, and
- 5 that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
