A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to a study on the prevalence of the use of psychoactive or psychotropic medication by persons who have committed suicide. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. (a) In this Act: 5 "Commission" means the Health and Human Services 6 (1)Commission. 7 (2) "Psychoactive medication" 8 has the meaning assigned by Section 242.505, Health and Safety Code. 9 (3) "Psychotropic medication" 10 has the meaning assigned by Section 266.001, Family Code. 11 12 (b) The commission shall conduct a study evaluating the prevalence of the use of psychoactive or psychotropic medication by 13 14 persons who are reported to have committed suicide. The study must 15 evaluate: (1) for persons for whom a report described by 16 Subsection (c) indicated the use of psychoactive or psychotropic 17 18 medication: (A) the period of time the person was taking 19 20 psychoactive or psychotropic medication; 21 (B) the medication the person was taking; 22 (C) whether there is evidence of the person 23 experiencing withdrawal symptoms; and if applicable, the period of time the person 24 (D)

1 was experiencing withdrawal symptoms; and

2 (2) for persons for whom a report described by 3 Subsection (c) did not indicate the use of psychoactive or 4 psychotropic medication:

5 (A) whether there is evidence of the person 6 having recently discontinued using psychoactive or psychotropic 7 medication; and

8 (B) whether there is evidence of the person9 experiencing withdrawal symptoms.

10 (c) In conducting the study, the commission shall use 11 autopsy reports, toxicology reports, police reports, and other 12 information related to persons who are reported to have committed 13 suicide that are:

14 (1) collected between January 1, 2016, to December 31,15 2022; and

16 (2) concerning persons who resided in counties with a17 population of 450,000 or more.

(d) Not later than October 1, 2023, the commission shall prepare and submit to the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of representatives a written report containing the results of the study.

(e) The study required by this Act is a public record underChapter 552, Government Code.

(f) The commission shall comply with all applicable state and federal laws regarding personally identifiable information in conducting the study.
